On Wednesday, August 4, 1993, at 7:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the item may be heard, Town Council will consider a Planning Report on the progress of the Town's on-going Review of its Official Plan. The meeting will be held in the Council Chambers, Pickering Civic Complex, One The Esplanade, Pickering, L1V 6K7.

All residents, landowners and others interested in the Review are invited to the Council Meeting. Copies of the Planning Report will be available from the Town Clerk's Department on or after July 26, 1993 and at the meeting.

As part of the Town's Official Plan Review, a document entitled "Background Number One: Emerging Planning Issues and Priorities" was released in March of this year. Copies of this document are still available from the Town of Pickering Planning Department. You are invited to pick up a copy of the Background and provide comments to this Department.
