65th REUNION IN PARK

162 years after Thomas Dowswell arrived in Canada from Devonshire, England, a large contingent of his descendants gathered at Memorial Park Saturday for their 65th family reunion.

"There's only a couple of years we missed during the Second World War," explained family representative Mike Kenny. "Last year there

were four generations represented. We have people from Maryland, British Columbia and the East Coast and we have a historian that looks after all our books. The age group is from about from 14 to 87. Some of our relatives are from Stouffville and about 85 per cent of our reunions are held here."

SLIDE PRESENTATION

Susanne Hilton, a Northwest Coast ethnologist who lives in Stouffville, will give a slide presentation on traditional and contem-

porary Northwest Coast native cultures at Latcham Gallery tonight (July 21). "I'm going to be giving an overview - talking a little bit about the cultures and some of the ceremonial life," explained Hilton. "I've done all of my research on the Northwest Coast and I have some really old slides taken from some of the earlier anthropologists. I also have some contemporary slides I took myself of some of the potlatches and totem poles that have been carved within my generation." The thrust of her presentation will be cultural rather than political, said Hilton, but she welcomes questions from the audience on all aspects of the topic. All interested residents are invited to attend her talk, which is part of the gallery's current exhibition, "Reminders of their Presence."


