

ST Indians off to OBA tournament

It's on to the Ontario Baseball Association (OBA) Major Mosquito C championships for the Stouffville Indians.

The Indians took all three games played at the three team provincial playdown held in Tottenham Aug. 7-8, taking two in a row from the host team to clinch their ticket to the OBA tournament in September.

The Indians started out with a 2-0 victory over Uxbridge.

Pitchers Noah Laird and Mike Vandervoort shared the shutout. Laird picked off two Uxbridge runners attempting to steal third base.

Blair Cain and Rob Howie scored the Indians' runs on hits by Casey Maude and Vandervoort.

The Indians then went on to outslug Tottenham 14-10, as pitcher Nick Siraughan weathered the storm to pick up the win for

Stouffville. The Indians routed Tottenham 22-8 in a mercy shortened second game.

Maude, Brenton James, and Cain headed up a fired up Stouffville offence. Laird pitched five innings

of impressive relief for the Indians, who got outstanding defensive play from Gus Norton and Trevor Day.

Maude batted .800 in the two games against Tottenham, while James and Cain combined for 12 hits, eight runs, and 14 RBI's.

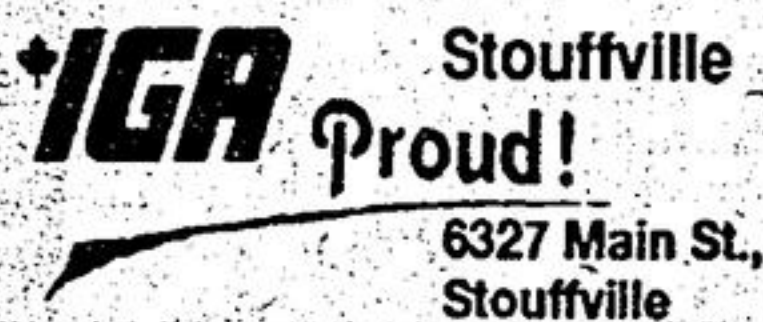
