



## NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF A DEVELOPMENT CHARGES BY- LAW FOR HYDRO-ELECTRIC DEVELOPMENT BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville passed By-Law Number 93-115 on the 10th day of August 1993 under section 3(1) of the Development Charges Act R.S.O. 1990 cD.9. with respect to Hydro Electric Development Charges for growth-related municipal services.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-Law by filing with the Town Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville no later than the 14th day of September, 1993, notice of appeal setting out objections to the By-Law and the reasons in support of the objection.

The Development Charges imposed under By-Law 93-115 are as follows:

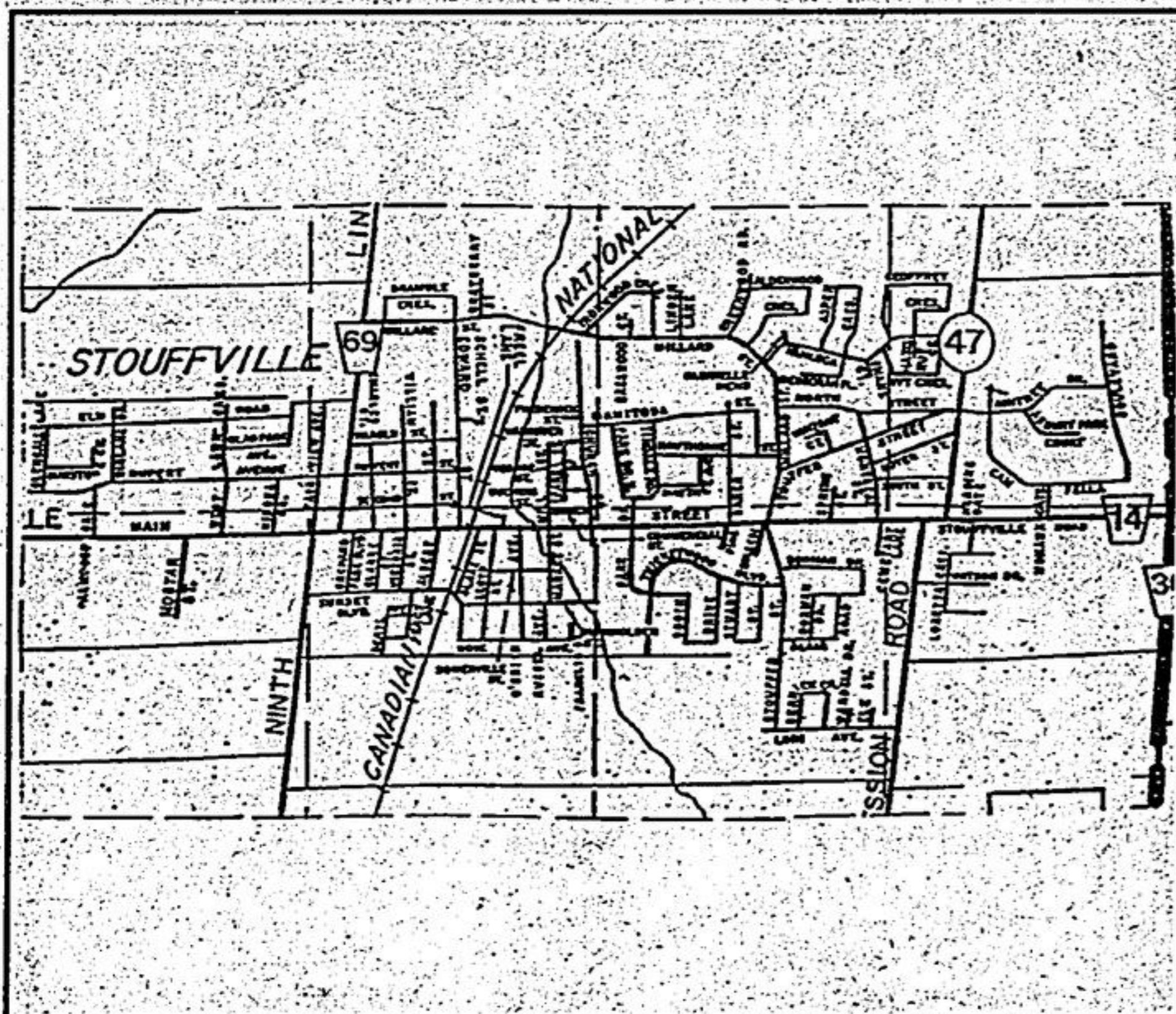

Single and semi-detached units	\$516.00
2 Bedroom and larger Apartments and 2 Bedroom Townhouses	\$340.00
Bachelor and One Bedroom Apartments (Including Sr. Citizen Units)	\$315.00
All other Units	\$365.00

NON-RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT TYPE	DEVELOPMENT CHARGE PER SQ. FOOT OF GROSS FLOOR AREA
All non-residential development	\$0.75

Development charges shall be imposed upon all development of land, buildings or structures throughout the Community of Stouffville.

## WASTE MANAGEMENT PUBLIC NOTICE COMMENCING SEPTEMBER 7TH, 1993

The Corporation of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has adopted a new By-Law No. 93-116 for the collection and removal of garbage in the Town.

Certain provisions of the by-law have been summarized as follows:

- Garbage shall be collected once a week Tuesday to Friday inclusive commencing September 7th, 1993.
- In the areas where the garbage collection day has changed, the residents will be notified by hand delivered notices.
- Recyclables shall be collected every other week on the same day as the regular garbage pickup.
- All garbage shall be placed in a container or plastic bag designed and sold for the purpose of containing garbage and the weight of the container and its contents shall not exceed 22 kgs. (50 lbs.)
- The number of containers placed for collection shall not exceed three (3) for each assessed dwelling unit, commercial establishment, industrial establishment, commercial unit, industrial unit.
- Non-collectible waste shall include but is not limited to:
  - Recyclable materials collected under the Blue Box recycling program operated by the Town.
  - corrugated cardboard, hazardous wastes, building materials, leaves, grass and organic wastes.
  - tires, batteries and automobile parts.

#### Large Article Collection

Collection of bulk items shall be provided one per month in accordance with the following:

#### Garbage Collection Day

Tuesday  
Wednesday  
Thursday  
Friday

#### Large Article Collection

First Monday of the Month  
Second Monday of the Month  
Third Monday of the Month  
Fourth Monday of the Month

Should the regular collection day occur on a holiday the collection shall take place the following Monday.

#### The Whitchurch-Stouffville Recycling Depot

The recycling depot, located at the Stouffville Works Yard, is operated by the Whitchurch-Stouffville Recycling Group. The depot is open to all residents, including those not receiving blue box collection.

#### Hours of Operation:

Thursday - 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon  
Saturday - 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon

#### Acceptable Material:

- Corrugated cardboard, egg cartons
- Fine paper, computer paper
- Newspaper, telephone books
- Glass and metal food and beverage containers

#### Recycling Yard Wastes

Organic yard wastes have been banned from the Keele Valley Landfill to help conserve its remaining capacity. Residents are requested to compost much of their yard waste or assist by taking measures to reduce the amount of yard waste.

Residents should not let their grass get too tall before cutting it. Grass clippings, less than one inch (25mm) long can be left on the lawn to fertilize the soil. In addition, grass and leaves can be mulched and placed around shrubs and plants to hold in moisture and deter weed growth.

#### Yard Waste Collection

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville will provide special collection of organic yard waste on the regularly scheduled garbage collection days during the following weeks:

October 25th to 29th

November 15th to 19th

Yard waste must be placed at the curb by 7:00 a.m. in **CLEAR PLASTIC BAGS** or tied in bundles having dimensions not greater than four feet long and one foot in diameter and weighing not more than fifty (50) pounds. Branches must not be more than six inches in diameter.

#### York Region's Composting Facility

Residents who have large quantities of yard waste or who do not wish to keep their yard waste until the next collection, may take this material to the York Region's Composting Facility. This facility is located on the south side of Bloomington Road, just west of Leslie Street and is open 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, excluding statutory holidays.

#### Household Hazardous Waste

Household Hazardous Waste collection is scheduled for September 23rd, 24th and 25th at the Recreation Complex.

Residents may dispose of hazardous waste at Keele Valley Hazardous Waste Depot (McNaughton Road, west of Keele Street in Maple). The hours of operation are subject to change and certain restrictions apply; therefore, call Metro's hotline at 392-4330 for details.

#### Keele Valley Landfill

Residents of York Region may dispose of residential garbage, large articles, home improvement waste or illegally dumped waste at the landfill free of charge. For more information on the free disposal policy, please contact Keele Valley Landfill site at 832-0682.

#### Illegal Dumping

By-law 93-116 prohibits the illegal dumping of refuse and debris on Town road allowances and private property. Contravention of this by-law is subject to a maximum fine of \$5,000 upon conviction.
