RURAL AREA RESIDENTS

Town operated garbage collection service will commence in the rural area of the Town of Pickering on Wednesday, September 1, 1993. Residents fronting onto and living east of Regional Road 1 (Brock Road) will receive collection every Wednesday. All areas west of Regional Road 1 will be serviced every Friday.

Residents are requested to place white goods such as refrigerators and stoves out for pick-up on the first collection day of each month. Other large items will be picked-up with regular garbage. All materials must be at the roadside for collection by 7:00 a.m.

Non-collectible items include building material or building rubbish, automotive parts and household hazardous wastes such as paint, oil, thinners, pesticides, propane tanks, etc. These items must be disposed at the Brock West Landfill Site.

Residents are responsible to review local newspapers for information on the rescheduling of Holiday collections.

Kidney Foundation fundraiser in region

Kidney Foundation volunteers in York Region aren't nuts, they're just selling them and it's for a good cause.

The annual Peanut Campaign, which raises money in aid of kidney patients, is about to begin and organizers hope to raise \$12,000 in York Region. The overall Campaign goal for the Central Ontario Branch is \$145,000.

During September and October, Stouffville residents can purchase bags of delicious peanuts at specific hospitals, schools, corporations and possibly even neighbours.

Each bag contains 16 snack packets ideal for Halloween treats or light snacks. For only \$3 a bag, purchasers will be helping support research into kidney disease, patient services and public education programs.

Since 1964, The Kidney Foundation of Canada has provided \$28 million for research that has led to major advances in dialysis treatments, more effective procedures for organ transplants and improved medication for treating high blood pressure and anaemia.
