History books out now

The Whitchurch-Stouffville Historical Society has arranged to sell cemeteries. Not the plots of land, but booklets listing all the information from the tombstones, along with a brief history of the cemetery. Available at present are books on the Brillinger, Cook and Steckley family cemeteries; the Lee grave; Lemonville's cemetery and Churchill cemetery.

In other literary and historical news, the first book in a series on the Burkholder family has just arrived from the printers. This volume identifies the beginnings of the five distinct Burkholder families that settled in Ontario. It traces the first settler, his children and grandchildren, and brings most of the families up to about the 1880s. Burkholders in the Stouffville area can be traced to at least three of the families mentioned. A further volume is planned for each of the five families which will cover about another three or four generations for many, five or six for some, and bring the families into the middle of this century.
