

Buttermakers captures fourth provincial ball title

Chalk up another provincial softball title for the Stouffville Legion mites Buttermakers - and their manager Mary Myers.

The Stouffville rep squad claimed its fourth Ontario Amateur Softball Association (OASA) Mite B championship in the past five years Aug. 28-29 in Sydenham, north of Kingston.

The mites, who were finalists at last year's OASA tournament in Stittsville, swept their four games played to win back their crown.

The Stouffville outfit knocked off the host Central Frontenac team twice in the championship round to take the gold.

The Buttermakers advanced to the finals by blanking Stittsville 12-0 in their opener Saturday, then thumping Simcoe a 12-1 defeat in game two.

Stouffville pitcher Scott McDougall fired a ho-hitter in the Stittsville contest, striking out 17 batters.

Geoff Laird cracked a home run and a triple, while Adam Hoe had a three bagger as well.

McDougall shared the pitching duties with Shane Timms in the second game, with Timms and Brandon Tardella each picking up a double.

In Sunday's first game against Central Frontenac, McDougall pitched into the seventh inning, with Timms finishing up to seal a 5-3 Stouffville win. Robert Anderson had a key double for the Buttermakers.

The Stouffville crew clinched the title with an 8-6 victory over their hosts, as Dale Boadway and Jamie Wood each belted doubles to back up the pitching of McDougall and Timms.

The mites were coached by Ken

Wood, with Dave Ferguson assisting. For team manager Mary Myers, it was the fifth Whichurch-Stouffville provincial championship team she has been involved with.

Myers, along with her late husband Carl, managed the town's Vandorf Juniors who won the OASA Junior A championship in 1988.

The couple also managed the Stouffville Merchants, who won the Ontario Junior Men's Eliminations in 1990 and '91, as well as the Junior A crown in '91.
