Ticket books aid area unemployed

More fun for less money is an idea whose time has come in the lean, mean 90s.

Entertainment 94 is your discount passport to a vast array of events and activities, from tickets to the Blue Jays and Cineplex Odeon movie passes to fine dining and golf club green fees.

Every book purchased benefits the community in which it is sold, with the profit being donated directly to a job creation program for people within that community.

"A lot of people these days want to deal, bargain and find ways to save money," said Shirley Setter, a Musselman Lake resident who is selling the books in the Whitchurch-Stouffville area.

"Entertainment 94 has just been released, and the savings in it are effective immediately." The only exceptions are the two-for-one specials on tickets for the Blue Jays and the Toronto Argonauts, which apply to next season.

The first section of the book is devoted to fine dining and covers the Greater Metropolitan Toronto area, including Markham and Richmond Hill. Featured restaurants include Sanssouci and Trader Vic's in Toronto and the Cullen Country Barns Restaurants in Markham.

A large selection of casual dining spots and fast food restaurants are also featured in the book and, in the case of multiple outlets such as Lime Rickey's and Pete and Marty's, coupons are good for all locations, Setter explained.

Movie buffs can enjoy up to \$72 worth of savings on tickets to Cineplex Odeon movies from

Sunday through Thursday between now and Jan. 31, 1995.

38 golf clubs, including Foxbridge Golf and Country Club in Uxbridge and Lionhead Golf and Country Club in Brampton, offer coupons for one complimentary green fee when a second green fee of equal or greater value is purchased.

Substantial savings are also featured for Black Creek Pioneer Village, the Canadian Craft Show, SkyDome tours, the CN Tour of the Universe and the Metro Home Show, as well as many out of town attractions.

If you enjoy live theatre, you can take advantage of discounts covering a wide range of performances and events. Included in

the book are savings for tickets to the National Ballet of Canada, the Toronto Symphony, Young People's Theatre and Markham Theatre.

Discounts on ski passes, shopping, car rentals, cruises, movie rentals (including Video 99) and auto repairs are also featured, as are savings on local, national and international hotels.

And coupon holders save even during sales, enjoying a minimum 10 per cent off the lowest price of merchandise and services.

Copies of Entertainment 94 can be seen at the IGA, the A & P, Card's Hardware and Marianne's Variety at Musselman Lake.

"The book is a fund-raiser and the money goes back into the community or to support a good cause," advised Setter.

The selling price for the book is \$42.80, including GST, and it

can be ordered by calling Setter at 642-5613. Editions of Entertainment 94 covering other locations in Canada and the USA are also available at an additional cost of \$30.



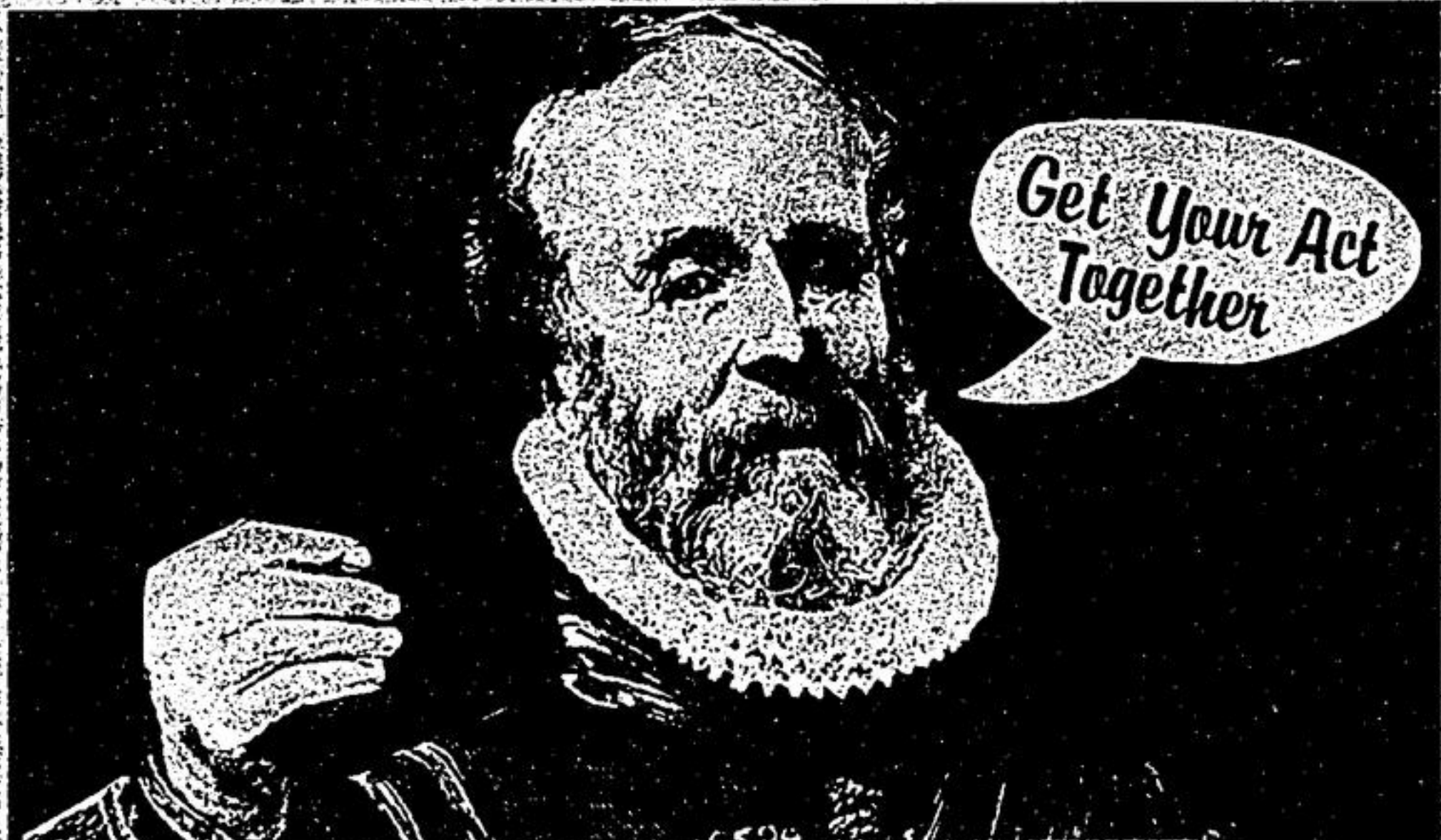

Tchaikovsky tribute opens YSO season

The York Symphony Orchestra opens its 1993/94 season in October with a concert honoring the 100th anniversary of the death of Russian composer Tchaikovsky.

YSO conductor Roberto De Clara will lead the orchestra in Tchaikovsky's monumental Symphony No. 5. Also featured in this concert will be Ines Pagliari and Norman Abbott performing the Double Concerto by Brahms. Concert dates are Oct. 16 and 17. For Christmas, the YSO's Dec. 4 and 5 shows celebrate the 20th anniversary of guest artists The Cantabile Chorale of York Region. On Feb. 5 and 6, the YSO welcomes outstanding young Canadian pianist Stephane Lemelin. He has already performed with the Montreal Symphony, Calgary Philharmonic and Edmonton Symphony and will play the Piano Concerto No. 2 by Saint-Saens. The rest of the program will be devoted to music from Paris, including Gabriel Faure's Pelléas et Mélisande Suite and excerpts from Stavinsky's The Firebird.

On March 26 and 27, the legend of the Thousand and One Nights comes alive as the YSO performs Rimsky-Korsakov masterpiece Schéhérazade. The season-ending concerts on April 30 and May 1 welcome Philadelphia native Joseph Lanza, concertmaster of Orchestra London, performing Brahms' Violin Concerto. The performance concludes with the triumphant Beethoven's Symphony No. 5. The YSO is now offering subscriptions for its five concert series.
