Ed. council welcomed

The formation of the Ontario Parent Council is welcome news in York Region.

The Ministry of Education announced last week a move toward increased parental involvement through an 18-member committee made up of ministry appointments, regional representatives, and parent group members with public, separate and francophone interests.

The York Region Board of Education is looking to start up parents councils at the school level, and although it is treating the provincial council as good news, has voiced some reservations.

Board Chair Bill Crothers said consultation is more effective on a local level to meet the needs of the community. He also said people who don't have children in the school system should be consulted.

Trustee Paul Bennett called the announcement a "long-overdue development."
