One of those, he reveals, will be to expand the food counter into a full-service snack bar.

Mountain bikers set to tackle Durham Durango Enduro event

Mountain bikers take to the hills for the first ever Durham Durango Sunday.

The fun event will offer a 40-kilometre course for novice and intermediate riders, and a 65-km. loop for intermediate and expert mountain bikers.

Both courses begin at Pleasure Valley, winding through the Glen Major property, the Durham Forest, and the Walker property, which is the site of a new hiking trail.

Organizer Eric Orschel says the Uxbridge mountain bike racer who also organized last March's Uxbridge Ice Breaker Enduro, the Durango is a fun challenge event.

"We just want to get more people involved in the sport," said Orschel, a physical education teacher at Dunbarton H.S. "We're looking for 150-225 riders. There will be \$1,200 in draw prizes, but there are no prizes for finishing first."

The Durango is being held in co-operation with Pleasure Valley, the Metropolitan Toronto Conservation Authority, and officials from the Durham Forest. It is being sanctioned by the Ontario Cycling Association.

Participants can preregister for \$20 by picking up an Enduro flyer at Muskoka Fine Water Craft in Uxbridge, or at Old Fire Hall Sports in Unionville.

Registration costs \$25 the day of the event, with riders asked to sign up between 8 and 9 a.m. at the Pleasure Valley starting point. The 65-km. event begins at 9:30 a.m., while the 40 km. ride starts at 9:45. All riders will receive a t-shirt and barbecue snacks.

A \$5 Pleasure Valley park entry fee will also be charged.




