Tues., Oct. 12 at 7:30 p.m. at the Parkview Village auditorium.

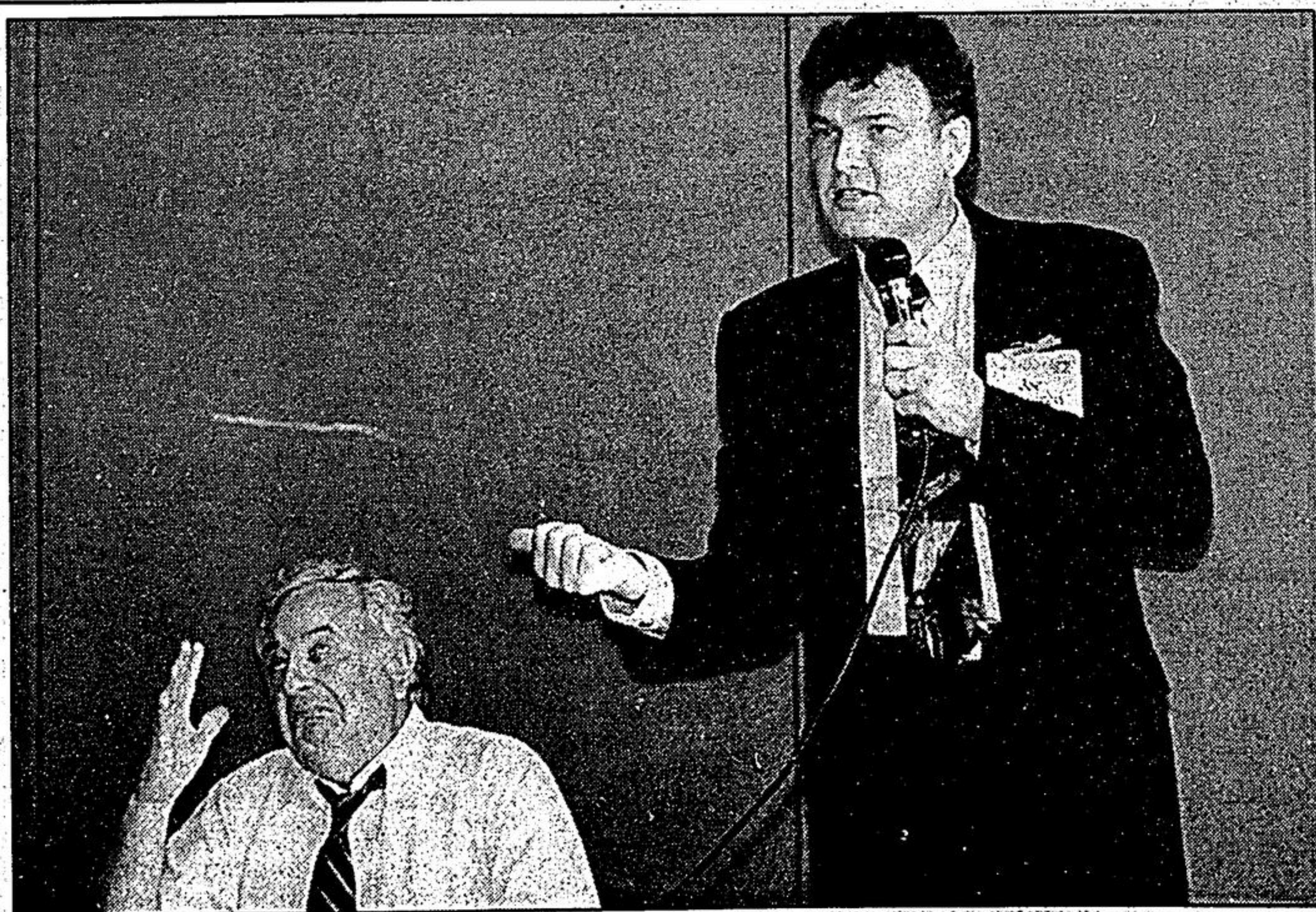
The candidates will discuss and debate important platform issues on such topics as job creation, deficit reduction, social services and immigration.
