

Snack box makes a neat gift idea

Thousands of Canadian children who depend on community-based programs for nutritional meals will now benefit from the sale of The Body Shop's Endangered Species Snack Boxes.

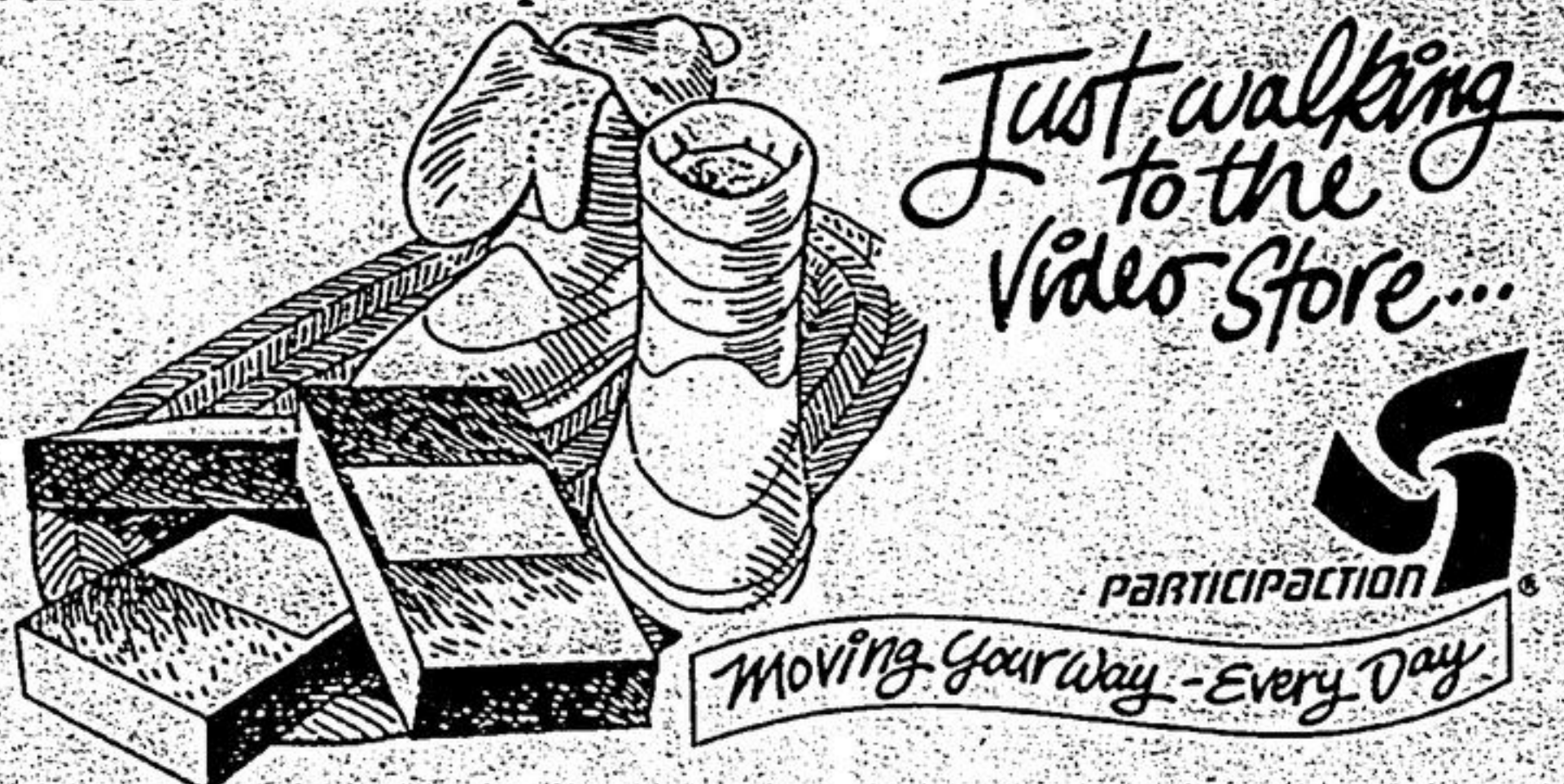
Until Christmas, The Body Shop hopes to raise \$50,000 for the Canadian Living Foundation for Families, through the sale of brightly colored, reusable Snack Boxes (\$1.95).

The money raised at each of The Body Shop's 105 locations will be used to support nutritional programs for children.

Fifty cents from the sale of each Snack Box — which doubles as a perfect gift box — will be donated to the Foundation for Families, a non-profit organization that works with more than 750 volunteer-based groups running nutritional school breakfast, snack and lunch programs across Canada. With all administrative costs being absorbed by the Foundation's sponsor, Canadian Living magazine, 100 per cent of the money raised through The Body Shop's Snack Box initiative will go directly to supporting the various nutritional programs. "It's a national disgrace that one out of every six

Canadian children arrive at school hungry and under-nourished," says Margot Franssen, President of The Body Shop Canada. "We want to do something to correct this situation, and our Snack Box Program represents a small step in that

direction." The snack box is made of durable, plasticized recycled cardboard; it features brightly colored drawings of endangered animals — including the Blue Whale, the African Elephant and the Giant Sea Turtle.

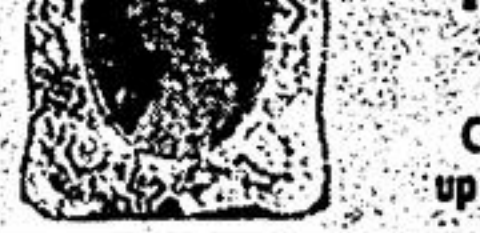

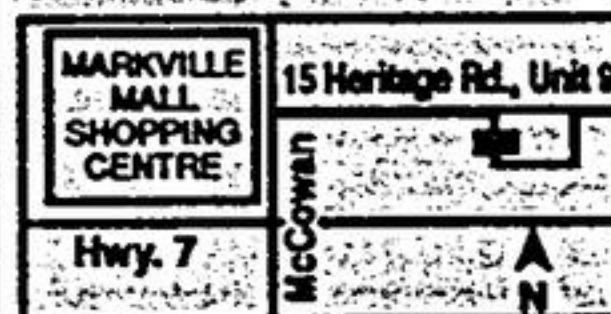

YORK-DURHAM SEWAGE SYSTEM HIGHWAY 404 CORRIDOR SANITARY SEWER SERVICING STUDY

PUBLIC COMMENT NOW BEING ACCEPTED

The Regional Municipality of York is undertaking a sanitary sewer servicing study of the Highway 404 Corridor to identify and assess options for servicing this area. The study area extends approximately from Highway 7 northward to Gamble Road (19th Avenue) and from approximately Bayview Avenue to Warden Avenue.

The project is being planned under schedule B of the Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Sewage and Water Projects.

Public input and comment are invited for incorporation into the planning of this project, and will be received until December 23, 1993. Subject to comments received and the receipt of necessary approvals, the Regional Municipality of York intends to proceed with the planning and implementation of the study outcome.
