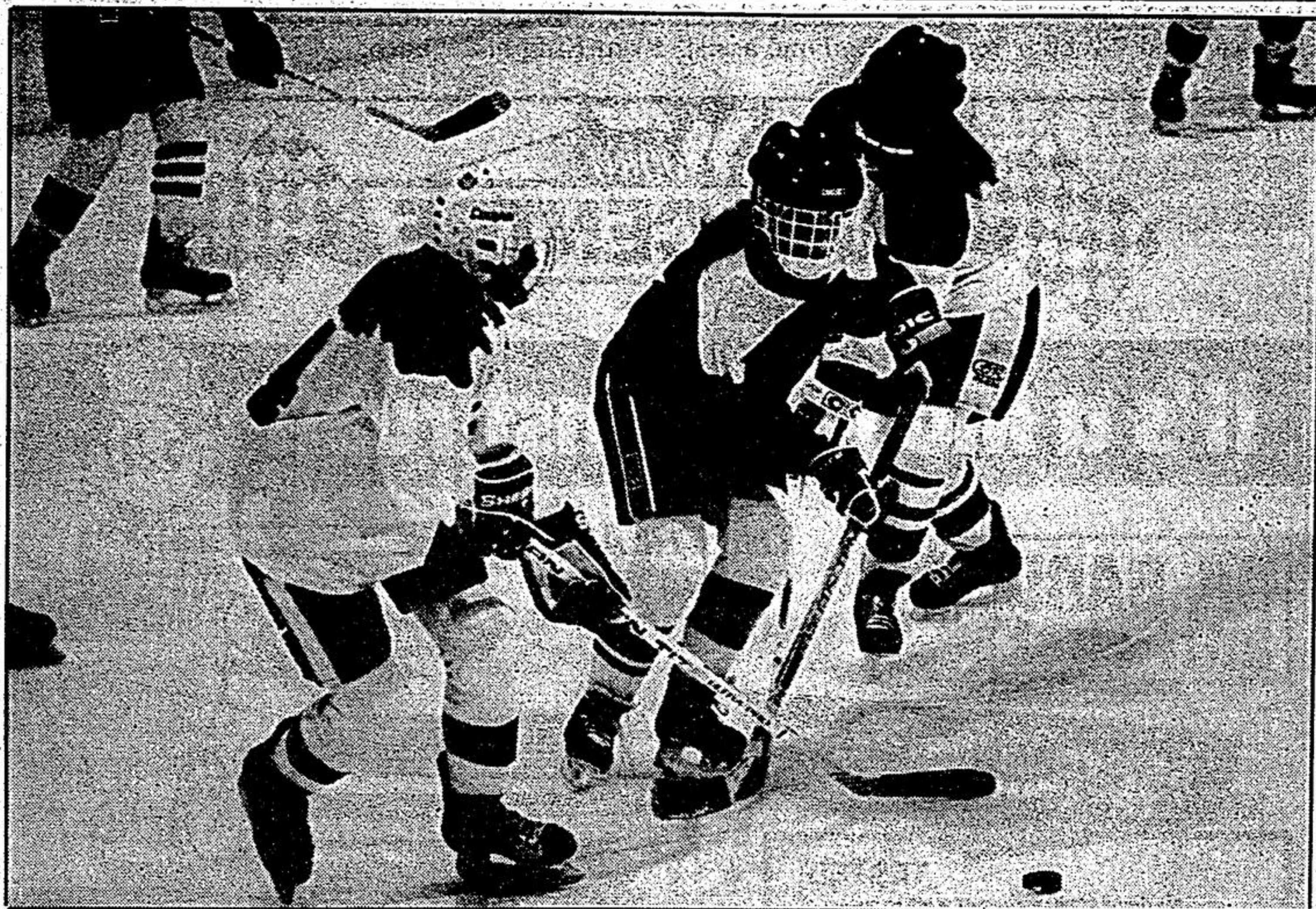

The Stouffville District Secondary School (SDSS) Spartans senior boys' volleyball team came up empty at the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Association AA championships in Ingersoll last weekend.

The Spartans, who fought their way to the provincial high school finals despite a rookie-laden lineup, dropped their three preliminary round sets before bowing out to Iroquois Falls H.S. (near Timmins) in the consolation round.

Perennial powerhouse Chatham-Kent H.S. took the title. Spartans coach Jim Fletcher said his team deserved better. "We were in every match," he said.

"We lost by scores of 15-13, 15-12 to the team that ended up as finalists (Monseigneur Doyle C.H.S. of Cambridge). We showed we could play with everyone there. And we were without Dave Giancoulos, who damaged his knee two days before we left for Ingersoll."

Fletcher praised his team saying his players showed they had "a lot of heart." He said they passed well under pressure, and pointed to the play of Jamie Sheridan, the only member of the team who won't be back next season.

"Jamie shone out there. I was really happy to see him do well in his last days as a Spartan."
