

Canada Post meets opposition to closing office

September

Canada Post announces Stouffville's Main St. postal station is being converted to serve only commercial customers, despite a vehement denial of any changes by officials just two weeks earlier.

Controversy erupts over ramp elevations on the newly constructed Ninth Line sidewalk.

Despite angry protests, the town awards a long-term garbage disposal contract to Miller Waste Disposal Systems

without putting it out for tender to other companies.

Mississauga mayor Hazel McCallion addresses the local business community.

A residents' group, Save the Post Office Committee (SPOC),

is formed to fight the proposed postal station conversion.

The local Terry Fox run raises \$15,700 for cancer research and Ontario Hydro considers a site between Ringwood and Altona for a proposed transformer station.

A body discovered in a Stouffville field is identified as that of Claremont resident William Edward McDonald, who died of natural causes.

October

Canada Post announces it will consider applications from businesses in downtown Stouffville interested in offering postal services to residents.

Norm Craven of Stouffville weighs in with the country's biggest pumpkin, which tips the scales at 835 lbs.

Provincial members of parliament throw their support behind residents of Altona-Glasgow in opposing the federal government's plans to sell excess Pickering Airport lands.

A controversial barrier separating two sections of Loretta Crescent is ordered permanently removed.

A Stouffville man is charged in a fraud scam involving secret commissions from IBM employees.

Federal Liberal candidate Jag Bhaduria sweeps into office on a tidal wave of anti-Conservative sentiment, capturing almost double the number of incumbent Bill Attewell's 18,414 votes.

November

A new vehicle for the fire chief, water meter installation and items for Ballantrae's satellite fire hall are priorities on the town's budget list for 1994.

The York Region Roman Catholic School Board faces bankruptcy with a deficit of close to \$30 million.
