

ASK A PRO

Q. I am going to remodel my kitchen, but I am having a difficult time deciding what kind of sink I should purchase. What do you recommend?

A. There are many new materials, shapes, colours and variable prices for a homeowner to consider when purchasing a kitchen sink. The best way that I could help you decide would be to give you a list of the different types with advantages and disadvantages of each.

TYPE	ADVANTAGE	DISADVANTAGE
Stainless Steel	- generally lower cost - numerous shapes and sizes - very durable - can be mounted under solid surface material - non-porous/no chipping - popular	- not much of a change from what we had for years - shows scratches on graining more than other types (except acrylic)
Acrylic/Fibreglass	- generally inexpensive - numerous shapes and sizes - non-porous - unpopular	- not suitable as a main sink - not heat-resistant - easily scratched
Pressed Quartz (Has many trademark names, i.e. Asterite, Quartzite, Silicron)	- numerous shapes and sizes - variety of colors - extremely durable - has continuous color throughout - will not flake or fade - heat and scratch resistant - popular	- generally higher in cost
Baked Enamel on Cast Iron	- numerous shapes and sizes - some can be under-mounted - very durable - non-porous - variety of colors - high gloss finish - generally less expensive than pressed quartz	- very heavy; takes 2 people to install - glossy finish can fade after years of use - if it does chip (which is not easy to do) it cannot be repaired
Solid Surface (Has many trademark names, i.e. Corian, Fountainhead, Avonite, Gibralter, etc.)	- non porous - flush mounted - fused together at counter; no visible seams - continuous color throughout - variety of shapes and sizes - popular	- somewhat limited color choices - only for installation in solid surface countertops - high cost
Granite	- totally different - unique - can be custom made to any size specification	- square edges - seams - porous - not practical - high cost - not for the faint of heart

Other things to consider are: lifestyle and whether or not you have a dishwasher or a second sink. Write down all your requirements and choose a sink, or sinks, that best meet your needs.

Also, consult a kitchen specialist. They have the knowledge and literature to help you with your decision taking into consideration many factors such as maintenance, etc.

Fifth person arrested in misappropriation


Another arrest has been made in the case of fraud involving the misappropriation of \$25,000 from the York County Bowman Association.
