MP Recall

Riding's options limited; Reform MP

More than 200 local residents, seeking any scheme to unseat their controversial MP, grasped onto a Reform Party pitch for recall last Tuesday night.

Amid applause and laughter, original Reform Party Member of Parliament Deborah Grey presented her private member's bill C-210 to a gathering of Markham Whitchurch-Stouffville residents. Grey, the only Reform member to serve a second term in the House of Commons, said the answer to the frustration felt by Markham and Stouffville voters wanting to replace MP Jag Bhaduria lies in parliamentary reform.

"There's a great swelling of support for the removal of this MP, but there isn't much that can be done without the rules being changed," said the Alberta MP who introduced the recall bill to the previous government and plans to do so again.

Recall would give constituents the power to remove MPs from office without waiting for the next election. A peti-

tion signed by half the number of voters plus one would be the first step toward a by-election, Grey said. She suggests an 18-month grace period after an election to allow an MP to prove him or herself.

Bhaduria was forced from the Liberal caucus Jan. 27 after an uproar over reports he lied on his resume. However, he continues to deny he misrepresented himself as a lawyer.

Bhaduria first came under attack Jan. 21 for letters he penned in 1989 to his employers at the Toronto Board of Education in which he wished they could be shot by mass murderer Marc Lepine. He is now appealing a decision favoring the school board after filing a charge of racism with the Ontario Human Rights Commission.

But Grey said racism does not enter into the current dispute. "It has everything to do with personal character," she said.

Grey told the crowd that there is no way to force Bhaduria to step down. "Like it, lump it, live with it," she said.
