MARCH BREAK AT THE MUSEUM. Whitchurch-Stouffville Museum is gearing up for March break with some innovative programs for older children. On Wednesday, March 16, from 1 to 3 p.m., children 8 years and up can learn how to make their own shadow puppets. THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

THE COUNCIL OF THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK PROPOSES TO PASS A BY-LAW AUTHORIZING:

1. **BLOOMINGTON ROAD (YR 40)/McCOWAN ROAD (YR 67) INTERSECTION, TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE**
 - (a) the widening of Bloomington Road (YR 40) from approximately 275 metres west of McCowan Road (YR 67) to approximately 300 metres east of McCowan Road (YR 67), in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, to a basic width of 36.0 metres, with additional widenings at cuts, fills and the intersection at McCowan Road (YR 67) to provide two through lanes and additional left and right turn lanes in each direction at the intersection;
 - (b) the widening of McCowan Road (YR 67)/7th Concession Road from approximately 200 metres south of Bloomington Road (YR 40) to approximately 200 metres north of Bloomington Road (YR 40), in the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, to a basic width of 36.0 metres with additional widenings at cuts, fills and the intersection at Bloomington Road (YR 40) to provide one through lane and an additional left turn lane and a right turn taper in each direction at the intersection;
 - (c) the provision of traffic control signals and partial illumination at the intersection of Bloomington Road (YR 40) and McCowan Road (YR 67); and
 - (d) the carrying out of all related works and undertakings in connection with the above.

Pursuant to Section 300 of the Municipal Act, the Transportation and Environmental Services Committee of the Regional Council will, at its meeting to be held at 9:00 a.m. on the 15th day of March, 1994 in Committee Room A at the Regional Administrative Building located at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket, hear any person who claims that his lands will be prejudicially affected by the by-law and who applies to be heard. Anyone wishing to be heard is requested to advise the Office of the Regional Clerk (Telephone 895-1231 or 731-0201, Extension 1303). If any party entitled to be heard does not attend at the hearing the Committee may proceed in his absence and he will not be entitled to any further notice in the proceedings.

The proposed by-law and plans showing the proposed works may be inspected at the office of Ronald Gee, Director, Planning and Design Branch, at the Transportation Department located at the Regional Administrative Building at 17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket (Telephone 895-1200 or 764-6345).
