Bantam Clippers advance to OMHA semi-final round

It's on to the Ontario Minor Hockey Association semi-finals for the Edward Murphy Painting and Decorating bantam Clippers.

The Clippers completed a three-game quarter final series sweep of Scarborough with a convincing 5-2 victory Friday night.

Scarborough drew first blood, but the Paint platoon stormed back with a pair to take a 2-1 lead into the middle period.

Ten seconds after Scarborough tied it at 2-2, the Clippers regained the lead and then won it going away

as goaltender Evan Boyd closed the door on the Scarborough shooters.

Rob Spytz led the Stouffville offence with two goals and an assist. Dan Tardella, Scot Assinck, and Jeff Hassard had solo markers for the Clippers. Assists went to Hassard, Tim Smart, Matt Turner, and Ryan King.

The Clippers will take on New Tecumseth (Schomberg-Alliston area) in the OMHA semis. The first game goes tonight in Schomberg, with game two slated for the Rec Centre Friday night.

Midget Clippers eliminated

The Cable Tech midget Clippers made a valiant effort to stave off elimination Saturday in their best of five, six point Ontario Minor Hockey Association series with Belleville.

But the Belleville squad persevered to eke out a 5-4 victory, finishing off the Stouffville outfit.
