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Students learn to resolve disputes

Pupils of Peace (POP) is a Ballantrae Public School initiative aimed at resolving conflicts through student mediation.

In April 1993, 20 students in Grades 5, 6 and 7 joined the school's peacemaker team and launched their own conflict resolution program. Team members are called POPs which also stands for Put Out Problems.

Those selected underwent four intensive half-day training sessions, which took place from Tuesday to Friday last week. Among the areas covered were communication skills, dealing with feelings and learning to handle different conflict situations.

"It's a preventative program that a lot of the schools are starting," said guidance counsellor Lois Barclay. "The students that are taking this program will be ambassadors to the school."

Not only does the program help to resolve conflicts, it also gives the POP students problem-solving skills which can be invaluable in later life, Barclay pointed out.

"I've made up booklets for the children involved, as well as the six adults working with them."

Staff members, a lay assistant representative and a parent representative are included

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
