# Plenty to see, do at schools

Education Week runs May 2 to 6 in York Region and local schools will mark the event with a variety of activities.

Ballantrae's junior choir is participating in the Lions Club Music Festival in Newmarket May 5 and a family math night will be held that evening at the school.

Police safety visits will take place May 6 and primary students will welcome a story teller in the afternoon.

A team of junior students will represent Ballantrae at the Battle of Books, to be held at Markham Library Saturday, May 7.

St. Mark Roman Catholic School invites parents to attend its open house Wednesday, May 4.

During the day, students from grades 4 to 6 will participate in a Young Authors' Conference, which will begin with a presentation by Ted Rogers from Mariposa in the Schools.

Workshops by teachers and parent volunteers will be part of the event and students will

read excerpts from their own published books.

A book fair will be held in the library throughout the week, and a school mass will be held May 5 at St. Mark Church to celebrate Education Week.

At Whitchurch Highlands, the emphasis is on the environment, and students plan to complete 100 related projects by May 3.

"We are not only learning about and communicating about the environment, we're doing something about it," advised staff member Dorothy Good.

Summitview's senior band will be participating in the Lions Festival May 3 and all students will be involved in the Spring Concert May 5.

The following day will include an air band concert in the morning and Career Day in the afternoon, during which students will learn more about job options in today's competitive market.

Orchard Park is presenting its second annual Mind Maze May 3.

This year's event is entitled A

Language and Technology Symposium and offers a total of 22 workshops, covering everything from cartooning and graphics to the fundamentals of photography.

On the evening of May 5, parents are invited to attend the junior division concert.

The following day, author Mark Thurman will speak to students as part of Young Authors' Day. Orchard Park will host an open house for parents and relatives in the evening.

Art work from Dickson Hill students will be on display at Markville Shopping Centre throughout next week and parents are invited to drop into the school Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday to see French immersion in action.

On Thursday, May 8 the school will present a French public speaking competition for students in grades 4 to 8.

From April 27 to May 6, a display of student artwork from local schools is being featured at Stouffville's Latcham Gallery, as part of Education Week celebrations.

### TOWN OF MARKHAM HIGHWAY 7 WIDENING NINTH LINE TO 0.5 KM WEST OF TENTH LINE NOTICE OF PUBLIC INFORMATION CENTRE

The Town of Markham on behalf of the Ministry of Transportation is undertaking a study for the widening of Highway 7 from Ninth Line to 0.5 km west of Tenth Line (Reesor Road).

The project will follow the requirements of a Class Environmental Assessment of Municipal Road Projects. (Schedule C)

Highway 7 from Ninth Line to Markham By-Pass is operating very close to or at capacity during peak periods. In addition the Highway 7/Markham By-Pass intersection is also congested during peak hours.

The Town of Markham is currently considering widening Highway 7 from a two lane rural road to five lane urban road and installing traffic signals at the Highway 7/Markham By-Pass intersection.

An Information Centre will be held to present the proposals and provide the public an opportunity to review and comment.

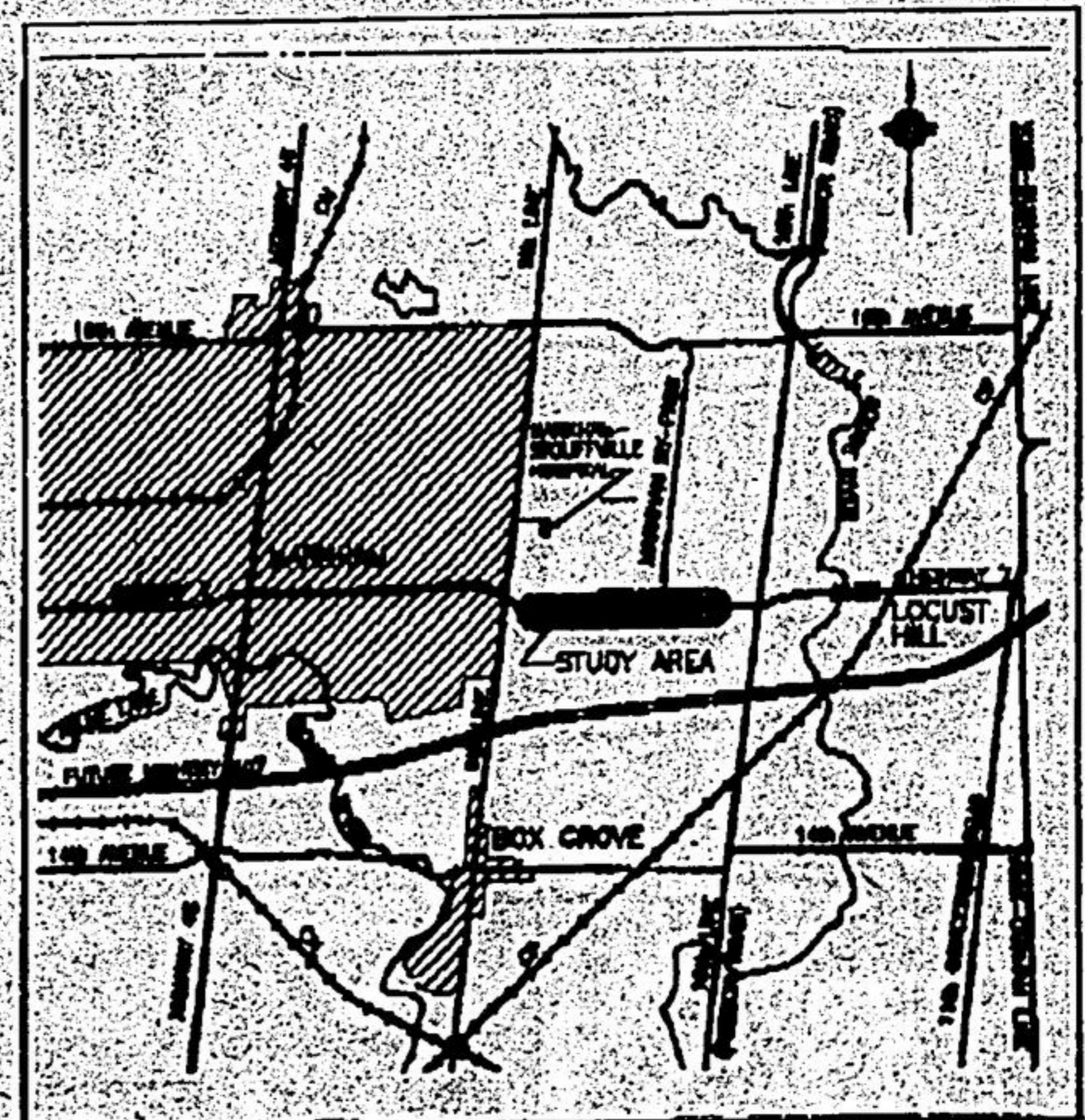
