1st Instalment Due - February 19, 1993
2nd Instalment Due - May 21, 1993

INTERIM TAX bills have now been mailed. Ratepayers who have not received their bills should make immediate application to the Municipal Tax Department. THE PENALTY charged for non-payment of 1993 taxes is one and one-quarter (1-1/4%) percent imposed on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter. Dear Beverly Hills

I have always had a weight problem. Since I was a child I have been overweight and have tried numerous diet plans, everything from Stillman to the T. factor diet. I then, at 23 years old developed anorexia and dropped to 107 lbs (I was 165 before that). I have been battling the increase & then loss of weight ever since. After I had my last child, Aug. 4/92 I gained 45 lb. and lost 33. I could not get the last 12 lb. off & I wanted to also lose the weight I had gained, when I quit smoking 2 years ago. I was able to lose the weight as the support of the staff was invaluable. They were encouraging and understood. When I went off the diet they were always available to chat.

I found it was easy to stay on the diet as it was sensible and flexible. It was easy to adapt it to my lifestyle (which includes eating out quite a lot).

Now that I am maintaining I'm sure I will not gain again & I will not go back to the extremes of the anorexia.

I look forward to keeping the relationship between Beverly Hills staff & myself for the next year.
