Cuts made at board

Night school students will buy their own textbooks and asbestos removal will be curbed as the York Region Board of Education continues to cut costs.

With a \$51 million difference between expenditures and revenues, the budget committee voted Wednesday to save up to \$60,000 by not paying for night school textbooks. An additional \$7,300 will be saved by not providing supply teachers for teachers planning a regional professional development day.

Money set aside for asbestos removal and encasing was cut by \$500,000 to \$1 million and school budgets will be frozen at the 1992 level despite a predicted student population growth of 4.3 per cent.

Before trustees debated the first direct cuts to programs, Family Studies Association President Jan Guillard appealed to the committee to not toss out family studies and technical design offered to all Grade 8 and some Grade 7 students. "It is possibly the only time young adolescents are exposed to this subject," Guillard said. "They need life skills if they are to cope with everyday life occurrences." Instead of eliminating the program, trustees asked staff for ways to reduce the cost of transporting children to family studies and design technology centres. The committee also declined to cut instrumental music and ruled out triple-staggered start times for students and cutting back summer school and adult education for 1993.
