

Local residents just keep on running

To some, long distance running is a little like watching a colony of ants at work.

From the outside, there doesn't appear to be much to grab your attention.

But for a pair of Stouffville residents who have fine tuned the art of marathon running, there is as much strategy and excitement involved in their chosen sport as in any other.

Fred Robbins and Kim Kavluk are both possessed of that quiet determination which distinguishes serious athletes from your average beer swilling jock.

Fred, the former high school running star who recently established the Stouffville Track Club, and Kim, who has several Boston Marathon's under his belt, took part in the Gatorade One Half Marathon in Peterborough the last day of February.

To listen to Fred describe the respective strategies of he and his fellow townsman, and the flow of the race, was like listening to someone give you a play by play of a hockey game involving the suddenly sensational Maple Leafs!

For Fred, the goal was to run in the top 10 per cent of the 600-runner field, and to do the 13-mile course in a time of approximately one hour and 20 minutes.

Kim was looking to come in at the one hour and 25 minute mark, putting him on course for his training for this spring's Boston Marathon.

But at the 18-km mark, Fred admitted to being shocked to look over his shoulder and see that he was about to be overcome by no other than Kim, who was running way ahead of his pace.

"This made for the traditional finish challenge running neck and neck pulling each other along," said Fred, who said the pair then "struggled up and down the last couple of hills together."

The pair passed another runner on the final turn, before Fred geared up for his finish surge, which helped him come in with a time of one

hour, 19 minutes, and 10 seconds - good for a 51st finish overall, well within his top 10-per-cent objective.

Kim was just six seconds behind his fellow Stouffvillite, giving him 56th position and a big mental boost for Boston.

After the race, the two runners spotted a third Stouffville runner, international triathlon athlete Dave Derry.

Dave's time of an hour and 33 minutes put him at 211th place, not bad at all for an athlete with three events to train for.

Who said running was boring?

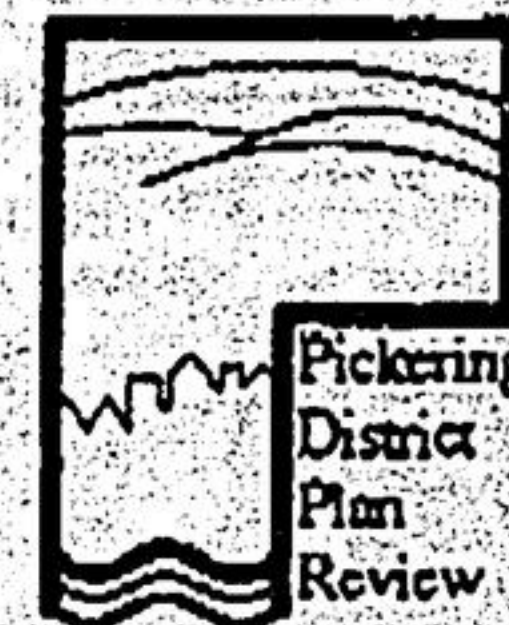
