Youngsters join forces for Symphly Family

The York Region Children's Chorus joins the York Symphony and York Symphony Youth Orchestra for two special family concerts.

On Saturday, March 27 they perform at Aurora High School at 7:30 p.m., and on March 28 they take the stage at Markham Theatre.

Entitled Symphly Family, these concerts will feature works by Kleinburg composer Daniel Friedman, along with

Ravel's Mother Goose Suite, Rimsky-Korsakov's Capriccio Espagnol and Saint-Saens' Danse Macabre.

The youth orchestra, and children's chorus will perform Toronto composer Nancy DeVries' Nanabozho and the Wild Geese, which will be narrated by Jennifer Armstrong.

Also, the youth orchestra will play selections from the Prince of Thieves, Haydn and Holst and the children's

chorus will sing several works of their own.

The youth orchestra was formed by the YSO in 1990, and debuted on stage in March of 1991.

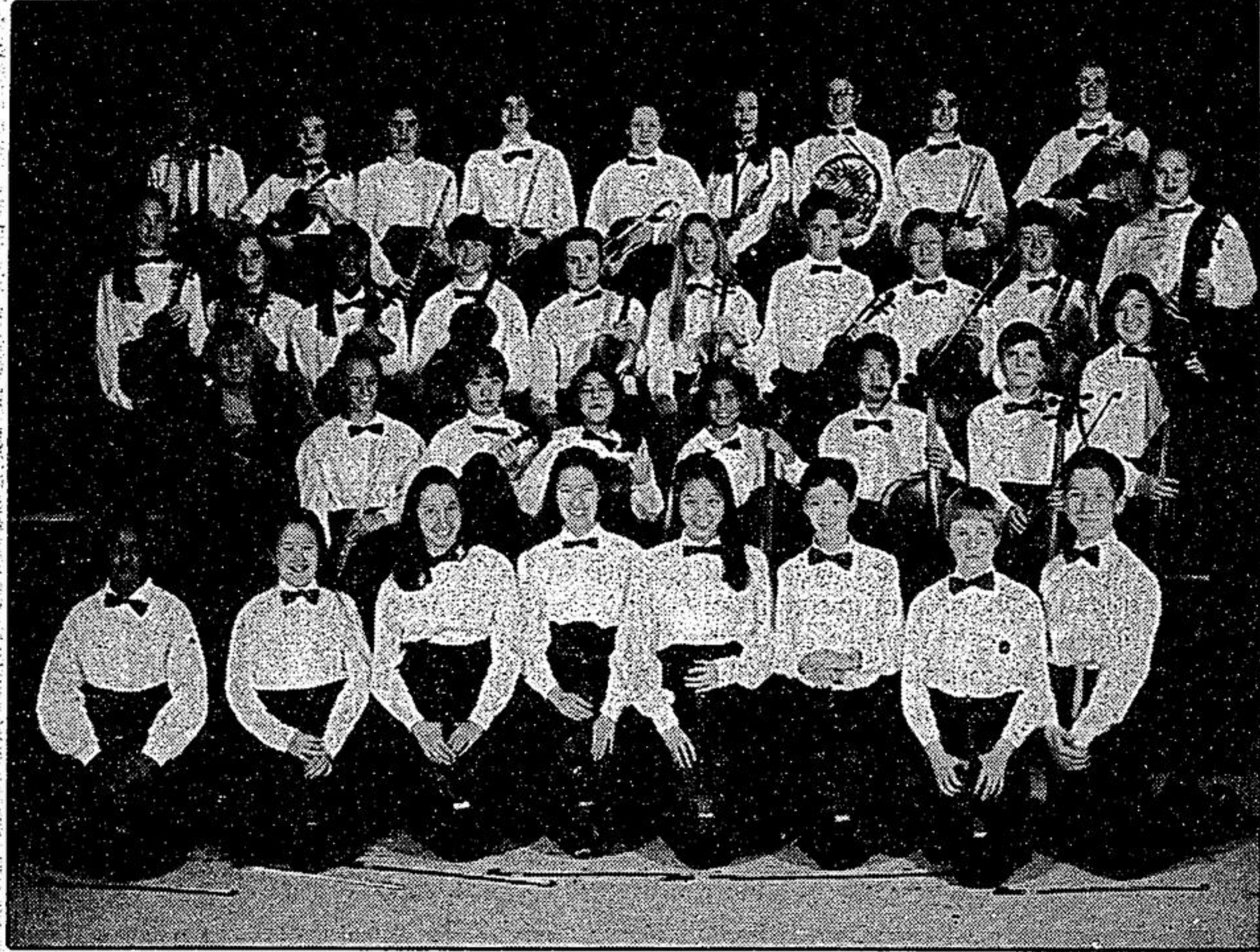
The children's chorus was initiated by the York Region Board of Education in 1984, and has achieved the gold standard at both provincial and national levels of Music Fest Canada.

Tickets for these concerts are \$14 for

adults, \$9 for seniors and students, and \$5 for children.
