## NOTICE OF CHANGING OF STREET NAME

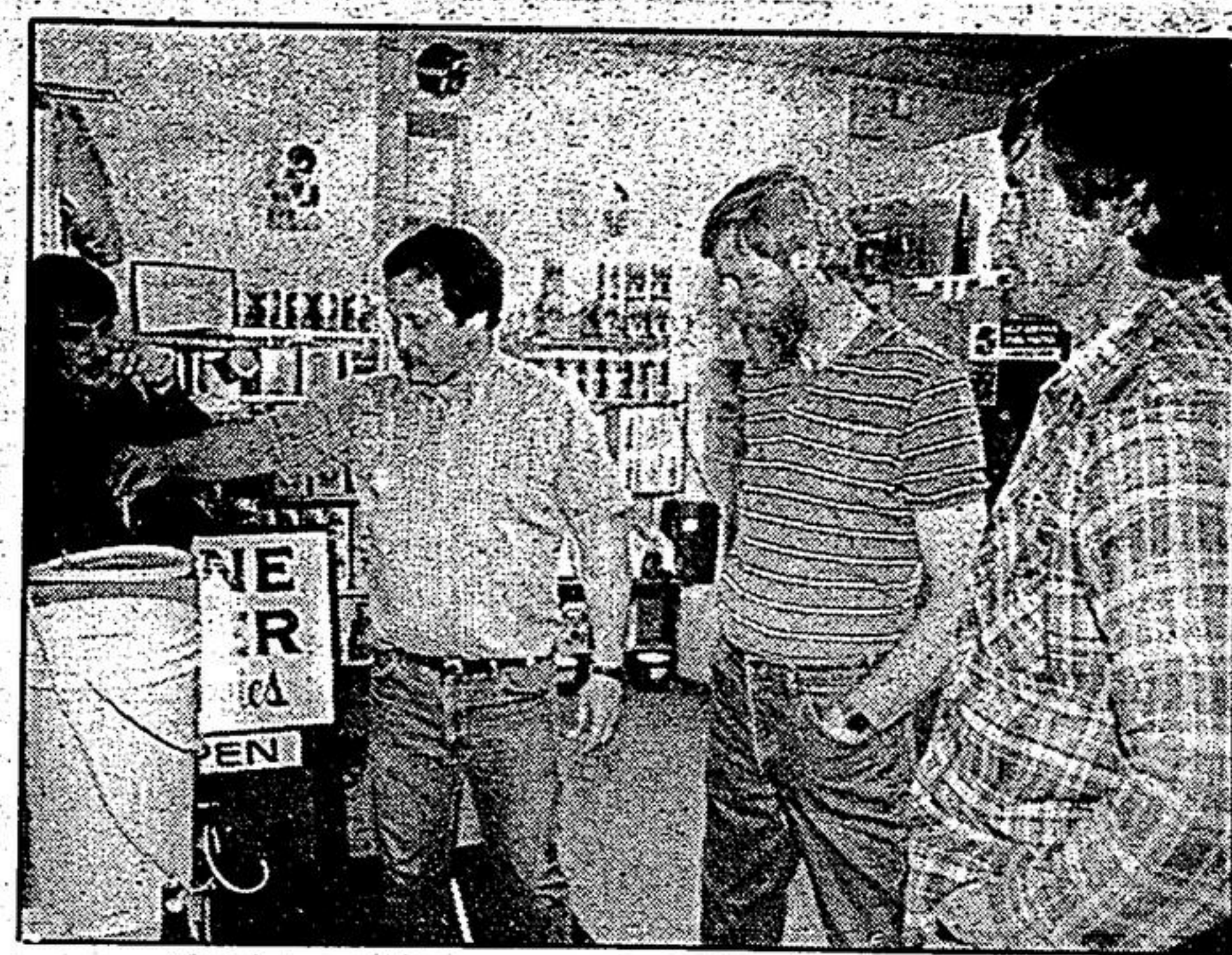

## Horticultural Society has a wealth of gardening information

A venerable institution in the area since 1924, the Stouffville Horticultural Society offers a wide range of programs designed to meet the evolving needs and interests of the community.

"We're changing our focus so that younger people in Stouffville get involved," explained treasurer Calvin Kennedy.

Gardening has become a major focus for many baby boomers in recent years and the society provides an excellent source of information and networking opportunities for everyone from the beginner to the expert.

"Horticulture takes in quite a large area, ranging from vegetable and flower gardening to environmental issues like composting and how plants can help our environment," Kennedy noted.

"We're trying to get speakers with a higher profile and offer a more hands-on approach. Some people feel intimidated because they don't want to show flowers at our shows, but you don't have to be an expert," he stressed.

"We want it to be not so much competitive, but more for the fun of it."

As well, the society would like to offer a walking tour of local gardens, offering prizes for the most outstanding.

"There are homes around town that have absolutely gorgeous gardens but they're not part of the society," said Kennedy, noting that annual dues are a modest \$3, and include a membership booklet.

"We're part of the Ontario Horticultural Association and we pay dues to them."

The local society receives a small grant from the province, but that is in danger of drying up, he added.

As it enters its 70th year, the Stouffville Horticultural Society is involved in a number of local projects, and was responsible for putting in the flower bed in the area across from *The Tribune* office.

"We've had a request from the CNIB (Canadian National Institute for the Blind) to plant that in their colors for their anniversary this year. We were part of the Peace Park and planted a tree on behalf of the high school," said Kennedy.

Meetings are held on the third Monday of each month from April to November in the basement of Stouffville United Church.

Specific programs include community planting projects, guest speakers on all aspects of horticulture, workshops on landscaping and flower arranging, flower shows and photo contests.

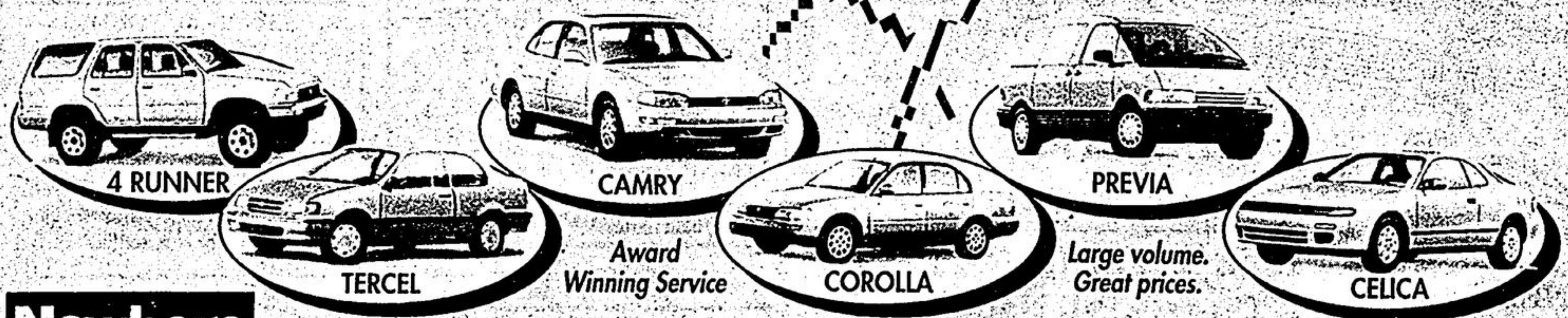

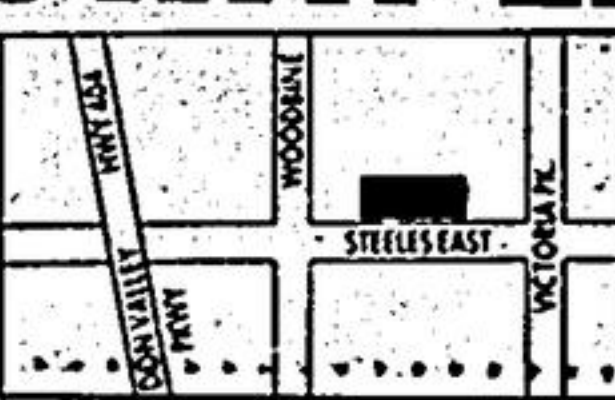
