Market concerts invade privacy

Dear Editor,
Re: Stouffville Flea Market concerts

I believe that any discussion of approving concerts at the Stouffville Flea Market should include mention of the unfulfilled commitments the market made to neighboring homeowners in December, 1989, in return for the homeowners withdrawing an objection which was at that time before the OMB.

In the settlement, the market owners agreed to address exactly those concerns, such as traffic and parking, mentioned by Councillor Prentice, but most of these commitments remain unfulfilled to date.

The Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, formally represented by counsel in the settlement negotiations, actively encouraged and supported this agreement.

Accordingly, when Mayor Sainsbury so vigorously defends what she has previously said she believes is the flea market's right to let its garbage blow freely onto neighboring residential properties, she takes on the appearance of complicity with the Flea Market's ongoing breach of the terms of settlement.

Councillor Prentice is correct in asserting that some statements made by Bob Panizza, in response to problems that arose surrounding last year's concerts, are apparently being ignored.

Personally, I found Mr. Panizza's participation in these matters made me a lot more comfortable, as opposed to now, when neither Mayor Sainsbury nor Councillor Ancheril appear interested in representing the concerns of local homeowners on the issue. The appearance given is that we don't matter as much as the flea market.

The comparison of the flea market concerts to the Strawberry Festival does not hold: the former events are private, commercial affairs with neither accountability to, nor participation by, anything other than private interests; the latter, a publicly supported and directed festival, in which any who care to get involved may participate. Furthermore, the festival has been going on for longer than many residents have lived here, and its activities are generally confined to the downtown district; these concerts are a recent imposition on a residential area.

If the flea market dealt with its commitments outstanding from the settlement, the proposed concerts would not have as severe an impact on the peace and privacy local residents have a reasonable right to expect. I hope our representatives at council will agree.
