lack of control over its operation, Dunkeld suggested his association would have to discuss the matter with town officials.

In the meantime, Dunkeld said it was essential to realign the existing set up so that the men's leagues were playing later at night.

"We've got to move men's hockey, put the men on later," said Dunkeld.

"That's a proposal that will come up at council soon."

Crowder confirmed the association's continuing commitment to the major-minor rep program, which breaks each rep category into two age levels. He said the association would have major and minor teams up to peewee this year and midget the following season.

"We've got to do it or else someone's going to get hurt," said Crowder. "Most of the other towns are doing it."

Houseleague convenor Matt Hawkins said he would upgrade his efforts to have coaches rate their players so as to facilitate parity in the houseleague.

He also said the bantam/peewee houseleague was looking into interlocking with Oak Ridges and King City for next season.

When local merchant Ian Boyd asked the association to find a better way of displaying sponsors' names on sweaters, it was suggested a system be used where all houseleague uniforms have "Stouffville" emblazoned on them, with a wall of the arena set aside for all sponsors' banners to be hung.

Crowder orchestrated the attack by smashing a home run. McKay and Marlee Johnson took to the mound for Stouffville.


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Ratcliff midgets gain split
