Local dance students win

STUDENTS WIN AWARDS
Students from Expressions, a local dance studio, made their mark at two recent festivals. At the Peel Music Festival in Brampton, which ran March 29 to April 8, students from the studio received 11 first place, six second place and three third place awards.

"There were over 35 schools entered," said Charlotte Mackay.

"As well, our jazz line's Sesame's Treat won a \$150 scholarship." At the Fascination Dance Festival in St. Catharines on April 23, 24 and 25, dancers from the studio were awarded 11 firsts, seven seconds and two thirds.

DOG TRIALS ATTRACT FRENCH CHAMP Professional dog trainer Jerry Cudahy is hosting a seminar and dog trial next month, and will welcome the French championship team of Guy Michel and his dog Cheyenne des Loups Mutins to his 10th Line farm for both events.

"The location is 11886, 10th Line, between Main Street and the 19th," he advised. The seminar runs June 10 and 11 and covers a wide spectrum of training methods. "It's for any-



body who's looking for a different approach towards dog training," explained Cudahy, adding that Michel and Jean Michel Moreau will be teaching at the seminar.

The seminar is \$75 for both days or \$50 for one day and people can register by calling Cudahy at 642-4382.

The dog trials, which take place June 13 and 14, are open to the public free of charge and promise a fun day out for the family.

"Guy Michel is coming all the way from France to compete at our trial," said Cudahy. "He is using ours as the last trial before going back to compete for the French championships." Cudahy himself owns North American champion Rocky with whom he won the overall grand championship.

The trial will include jumps, retrievals and obedience exercises. "The dogs that are com-

peting at the high level, or ring three, will have to work in the field for close to an hour," said Cudahy. Members of the Metro police Canine Unit are expected to attend the event and there will be refreshments available. "If people were interested in spending the four days here, there's room for campers and tents."

BLAIR RETURNING TO NATIONAL Congratulations to Blair Puenta of Stouffville, who learned last week that he has been accepted for a second year at the National Ballet School of Canada.

Blair was a student at the DanceCentre in Stouffville for a number of years before auditioning for a place at the National's summer school in 1992 and subsequently being selected as a full time student.

CHRISTIAN GROUP RECORDS TAPE Stouffville residents Darlene Campbell and Jenny Bowen are among a core group of more than 20 singers and musicians who are in the process of recording a tape of 14 original Christian songs written by Toronto musician Ruth Fazal.

The two women were originally members of a trio called Rainbow, whose third member was Betty Scuse. Her husband Paul is the former minister at Christ Church Anglican, who moved to Kitchener with his family two years ago. The couple is also involved in the new recording.

"Ruth came to Christ Church to do a special service for the children and she had been looking for a team and asked us if we were interested," explained Campbell.

"Rainbow ended and this group started, and we have been working with her ever since." Fazal is a professional violinist, pianist, songwriter and singer who played with the Toronto Philharmonic prior to its demise and who is now a member of the Mississauga Symphony.

"She has been doing a musical ministry within the Anglican church and ecumenically now for about 15 years in the Toronto area. Over the last while she has written many songs in the Christian realm, so she decided to go for a recording."

About 85 singers from various churches, including a number of area residents, provide a 'congregational' sound on the tape, which is scheduled for release this fall.

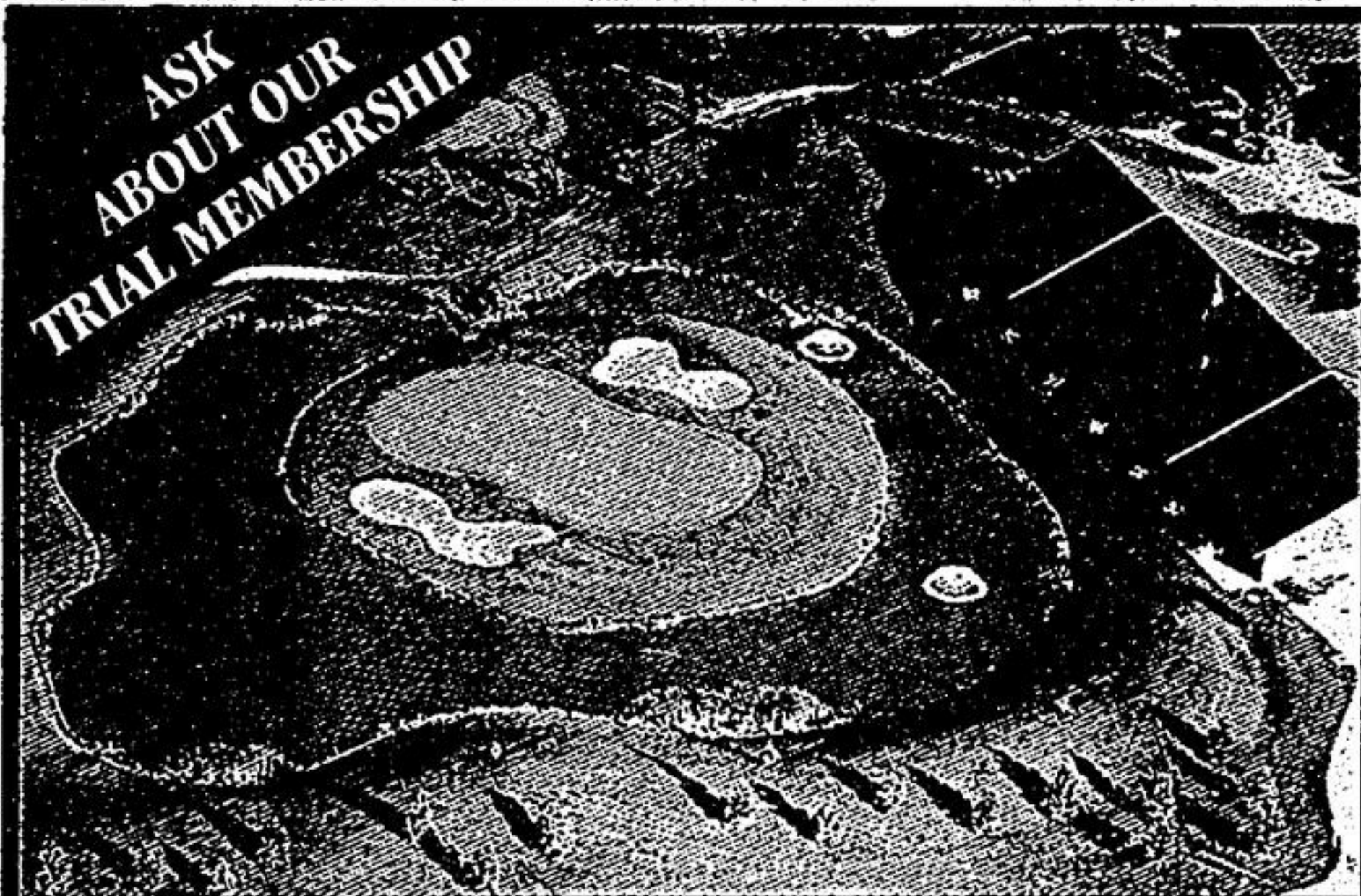

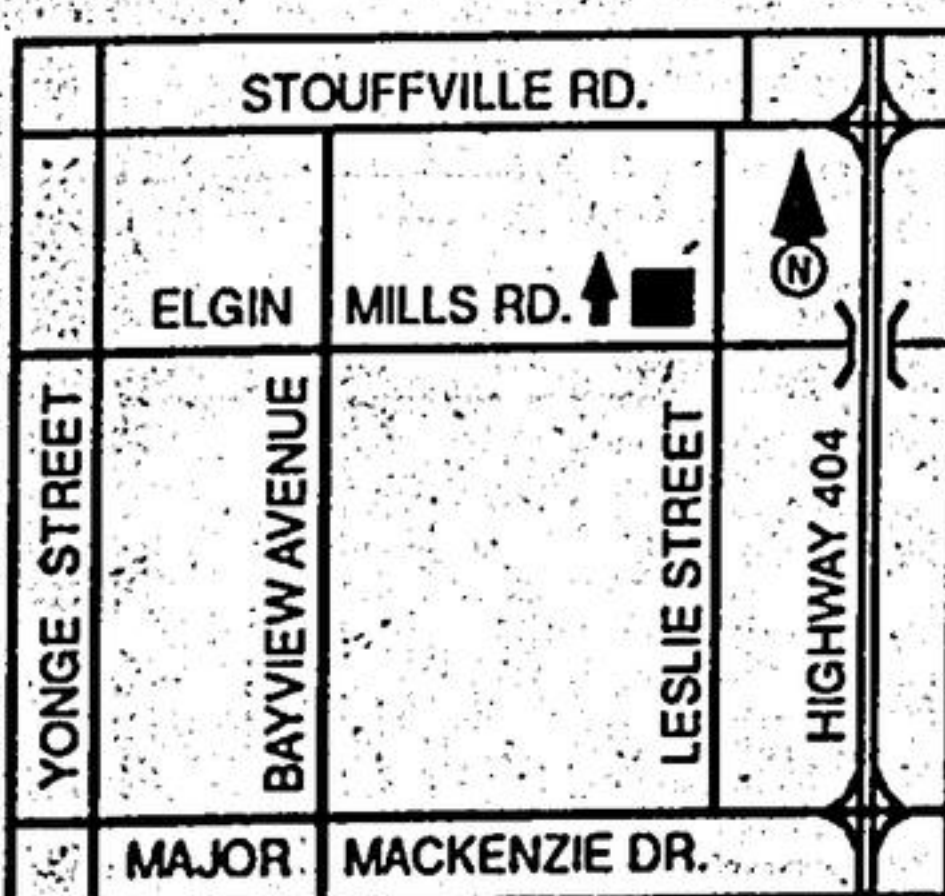
