FIRST INSTALMENT - JUNE 30th, 1993
SECOND INSTALMENT - SEPTEMBER 30th, 1993

Payments not received by June 30th, 1993 are subject to a penalty charge of 1.25% on the first day of default and on the first day of each month thereafter.

Five days of fun planned

It's just one week to the start of the Whitchurch-Stouffville Strawberry Festival, a five-day extravaganza of community fun.

On Saturday, July 3, a host of activities will take place in downtown Stouffville and Main Street will be closed to traffic to ensure a safe and enjoyable day for all the family.

Budding young artists are invited to participate in the Strawberry Art Contest. Youngsters between the ages of 6 and 12 can draw, paint or create art with a strawberry theme, and all entries will be displayed during the festival.

Prizes will be awarded in the following age categories: 6-8, 9-10 and 11-12. Children's entertainment with a magic touch will be featured in three shows at Country Club Donuts, taking place at 10 a.m., noon and 2 p.m.

Other events for youngsters include the Carnival in the library parking lot from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m., face painting on Main Street, the Strawberry Scavenger Hunt, the Parent and Child Crayfish Search, the Remote Control Car Contest and Dan Devion's concert in the park at 5 p.m.

The Main Street stage will feature a variety of great performers including the Shades O' Blue Police Band, the Music Mania singers, Lawnie Wallace, the Bourbon St. Dixieland Band and an intriguing mystery entertainer at 11 a.m.

Check out those beautiful antique cars, which will be on display on Main Street between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. And don't forget to visit the Silver Jubilee Club, the venue for three exciting close-up magic demonstrations.

A variety of refreshments will be available in the downtown area and the popular Strawberry Festival Cafe, located in front of the town hall, will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The second Baby Derby will be held Sunday, July 4 at 12.30 p.m. in west Memorial Park. The Baby Derby is a race for crawlers and toddlers of up to 2 years old and prizes will be awarded in both age categories.
