Wildlife photographer finds her niche

While Barbara Simpson did not set out to become a wildlife photographer, photography has proved an ideal outlet for her artistic talent and her concern for environmental preservation.

"I'd always been very enthusiastic about and interested in nature and I think I needed some sort of creative expression of what I was seeing," explained the Claremont resident.

"There's so much beauty around us and I feel many people just don't have the time to notice it."

Simpson's artistic inclinations go back to her childhood when she drew constantly.

"I've done quite a lot of sketching of wildlife but I can't seem to work in color. When I was a child, I read every nature book in the children's section of the library and then begged to read the ones in the adult section." It was in 1983, when she took a Canada Nature Tours Photo Safari to the Everglades, that she began to consider photography as a

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means of expressing her feelings about the environment.

Acclaimed nature photographer Wayne Lynch led the tour "and it really had a big influence on me." The following year, Simpson took another tour with Lynch, this time to Africa.

"It was a fabulous, once in a lifetime experience," she recalled. "We had some very close encounters with elephants coming right through the campsite.

"One day, when I was alone, I was encircled by them and I still continued taking pictures, although I was pretty ner-

It was, she said, "a very positive introduction to photography. I was really pleased with the results and I began to think I could do something with this."

In 1986 she returned to the Everglades, where she met renowned wildlife painter Robert Bateman.

"That year the birds were just amazing - they were practically falling from the sky."

Simpson returned with some wonderful photographs and

"So few people seem to appreciate that this is a really unique area of green belt, it's amazing that it exists at all and that it's large enough to sustain wildlife populations."

The 'bread and butter' of her photography is in equine photography, she noted, and her work has been featured on a number of Canadian and American magazine covers.

Whenever she can find the time, Simpson loves to travel around the province, camping and canoeing and enjoying nature.

Her work is currently on exhibit at the Herongate Barn Theatre and she is planning to put together a portfolio and a slide show of her work.
