Development

Council orders summer meeting on subdivision

After hearing a slew of residents' concerns regarding a proposed 53-home Millard Street subdivision, the developer has been ordered to hold a summer meeting with neighboring homeowners to alleviate all concerns.

Residents from Millard Street, Opal Court, Baker Avenue and Manitoba Street expressed many concerns regarding lot size, drainage patterns, school overloads, tree cutting, traffic jams, sewer capacity and construc-

tion interference during a packed public hearing Tuesday.

Dulverton Holdings Ltd. wants to change the institutional zoning on a seven-acre property fronting Millard Street to build 33 detached dwellings and 20 townhouses in two phases. The single detached homes would be built on lots with just under 40-foot frontages with townhouses on just under 20-foot frontages.

But that didn't sit well with Stouffville businessman David Barthau who views the

The sun shone and the crowds came out in droves, making the 10th annual Whitchurch-Stouffville Strawberry Festival an unqualified success.

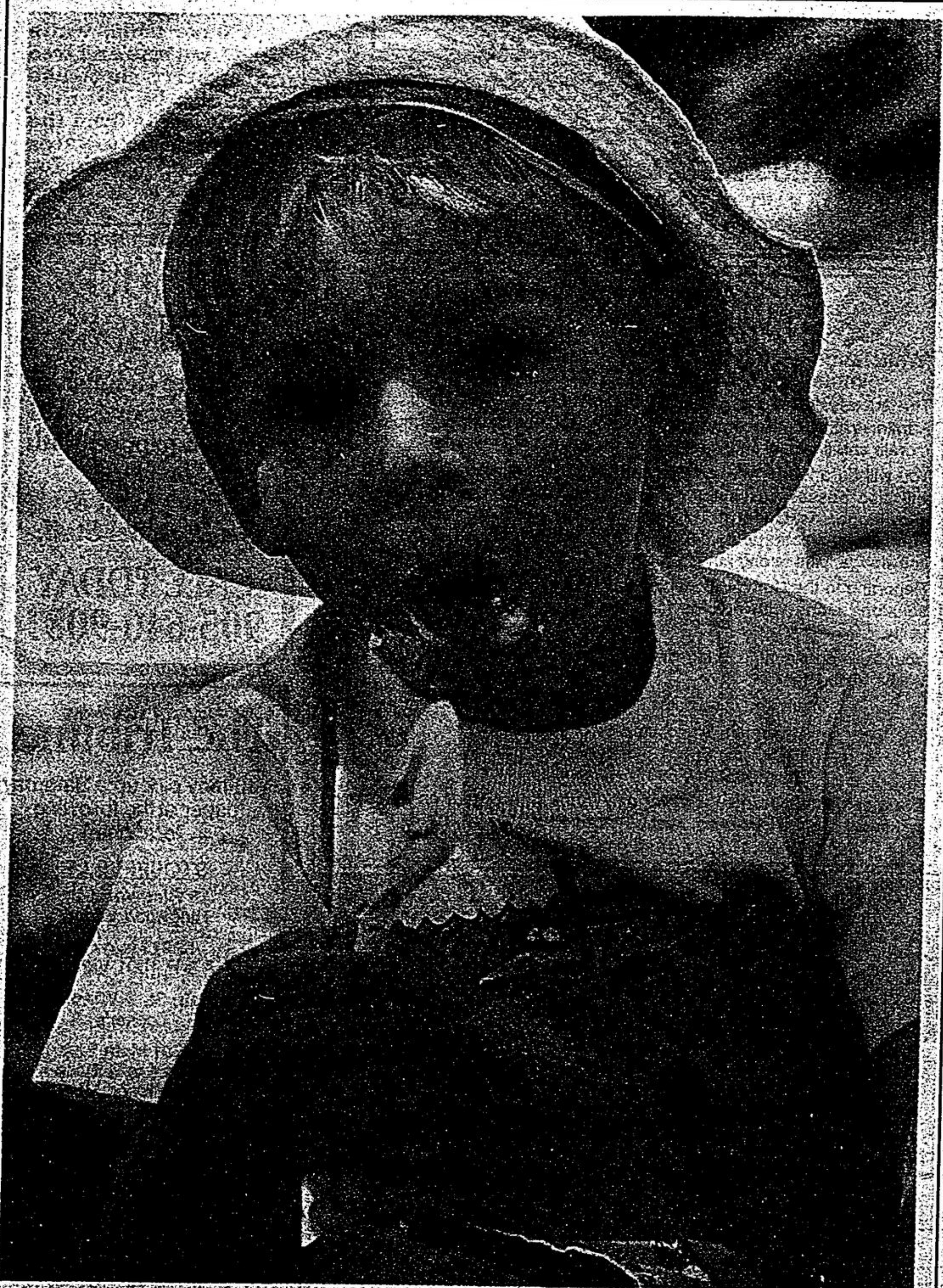
Among the most popular weekend events was the parent and child crayfish search, which attracted more than 200 entries, said the festival's publicity co-ordinator Sue Smith.
