Notice is hereby given to all residents of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville that the Preliminary Voters List, which includes the names of all persons entitled to vote at the Municipal Elections, is available for viewing effective September 6th, 1994. Electors are advised to examine the list.

HOW DO YOU CHECK THE LIST? IT'S EASY...

If you are 18 years old or will attain the age of 18 years on or before November 14th, 1994; a Canadian Citizen, and reside in the Town at any time between September 6th, 1994 and October 14th, 1994, or are the owner or tenant of property or the spouse of such owner or tenant - check the Preliminary Voters List to see if your name has been included. If your name is not included and you are a qualified elector, you can have your name added to the list by completing the necessary application at the Clerk's Office, Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville, 19 Civic Avenue, Stouffville. Likewise if there are any other corrections, omissions or deletions that should be made to the list, these too can be made by completing the necessary application at the Clerk's Office.

Residents should also check to see if their school support is correctly shown. It should be noted that you must be Roman Catholic in order to be eligible to vote for the York Region Separate School Board (English Language Section) Member and you must have French language rights and be Roman Catholic in order to be eligible to vote for the York Region Separate School Board (French Language Section) Member.

Revisions to the list may be made at any time, Monday to Friday, commencing Tuesday, September 6th to Thursday, October 13th, 1994 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and on Friday, October 14th, 1994 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
