New modelling agency open to all

So you want to be a model? Now you can find out more about the profession by visiting Cory Carmen Models International at 9A Library Lane. The agency held its grand opening last Saturday but you can drop by anytime, said owner Cory Carmen.

Carmen herself has been modelling for about five years and has spent time helping out at the agencies which represented her. "We teach anyone who wants to be a model anything and everything they could possibly know about modelling," she explained.

The agency offers courses for people of all ages and will work with retailers and businesses in the area to generate jobs for clients. "I'll get them local work to give them experience, which will be helpful if they go with a bigger agency later on."

Carmen will also be on the lookout for people who are interested in teaching classes or who want to learn more about the management aspect of the modelling industry.

As well as teaching runway work, makeup and wardrobe, the agency will give advice on how to deal with payment problems and assignments which models may not feel comfortable with.

Even for those who are not interested in a modelling career, said Carmen, the classes can provide valuable information about what to wear and how to apply make up, giving

clients greater self-confidence and helping them to make the most of themselves.

With a growing demand for models who are more representative of the general population, Carmen welcomes all ages and body types, with classes for adults, teens, pre-teens and children.

Local assignments could include working with retail stores or car dealerships and participating in mall fashion shows. The agency also supplies individuals for in-store demonstrations in supermarkets. Approximately \$3,000 worth of scholarships can be won during the agency's opening promotion, Carmen said.

"One person out of every age category gets a free scholarship."

Discounts will also be offered for runners-up, she added. During the course, clients will have the opportunity to meet with other agents. "We will have 'go-sees' and they can pick an agency or I will suggest the ones I think are best for them."

In the event they are not selected by the agency of choice, Carmen will continue to represent them. "Once they have finished the course they are on my books for fashion shows and other local work."
