NATURAL FEATURES OFFICIAL PLAN AMENDMENT PUBLIC MEETING

Proposed Official Plan Amendment for the Natural Features Study under Sections 17 and 21 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990.

NOTICE OF MEETING

You are invited to attend the Public Meeting to discuss the draft Official Plan Amendment to implement the Natural Features Study.

The Amendment applies to the whole of the Town of Markham and specifically the lands shown on the map below (Schedule I(iii) Greenway System).

BACKGROUND

In 1990 the Town of Markham initiated the Natural Features Study, with the purpose of preparing a strategy for the protection, enhancement and restoration of the Town's natural features. An introductory newsletter soliciting information on natural features and encouraging participation was sent to every household in Markham. Public information meetings were held in June 1992 and May 1993 to obtain public comment as the Study progressed.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT

1. To consolidate existing policies and include new detailed policies to address the protection, enhancement and restoration of the natural environment.
2. To incorporate three new map Schedules: I(i) "Environmental Protection Areas", I(ii) "Ecological Restoration Areas" and I(iii) "Greenway System" into the Official Plan.

In addition, the Amendment makes certain housekeeping changes to reflect earlier Council decisions and to implement the new environmental policies as follows:

3. To amend Schedule "A" to remove the identification of the "Open Space - Environmentally Significant Area" to allow the new designation "Environmental Protection Area" to take effect.
4. To redesignate certain lands in Lots 17, 18, 19 and 20, Concession 3, south of Major Mackenzie Drive and west of Woodbine Avenue, from "Hazard Lands" to "Commercial" and "Industrial" to implement development approvals already granted (OPA 84).

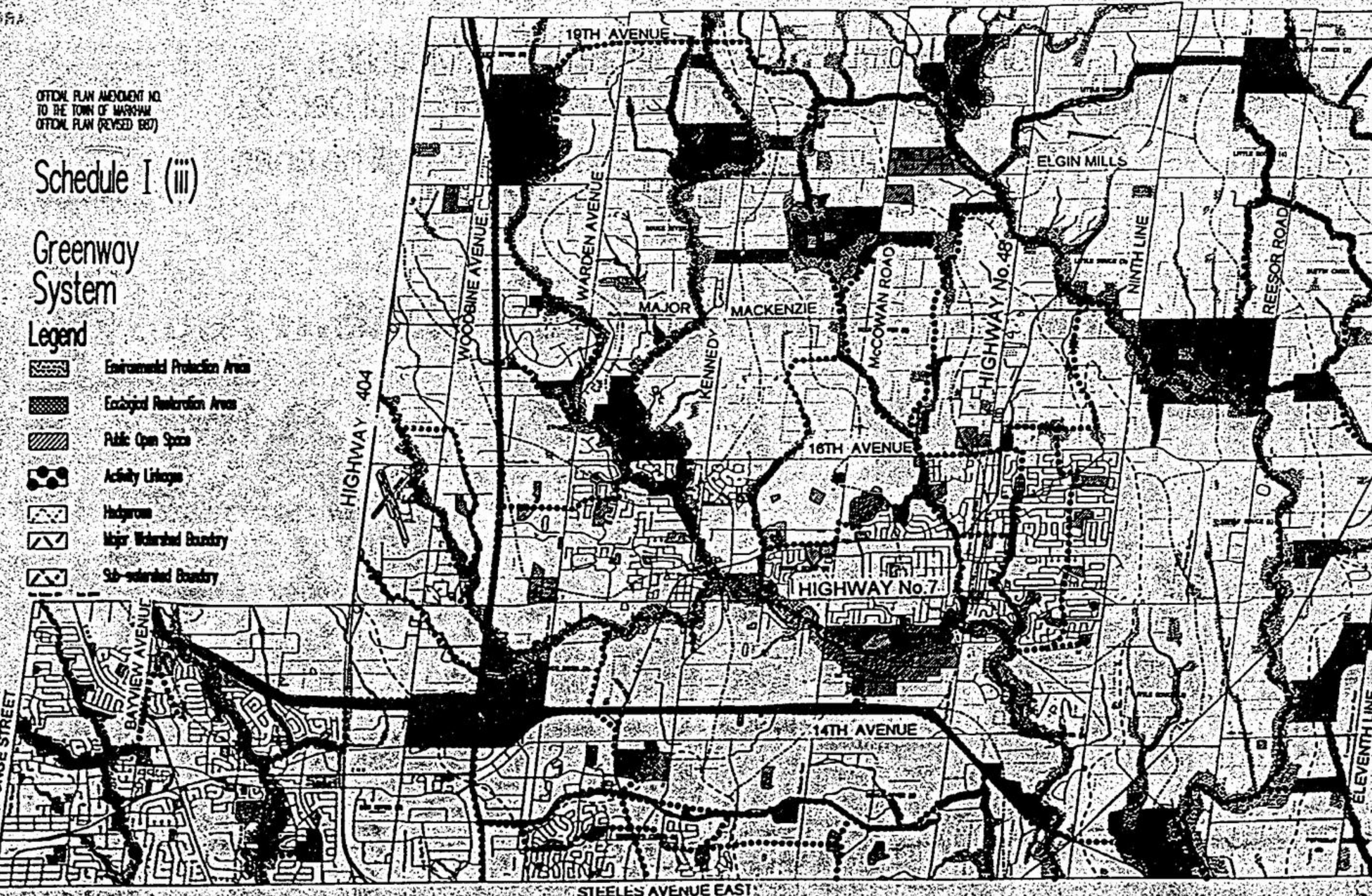
