

## Gladys Clarkson

Gladys Clarkson received the meritorious service award from the Stouffville legion, an honor given to no other person from the legion.

While she was "pleased and surprised" at receiving the award, Mrs. Clarkson told the Tribune she doesn't like to be the centre of attention, preferring to

work behind the scenes. She has no plans to slow down her busy pace.

## Nick Tatone

Nick Tatone traded his Ward 3 council seat for the position of general manager of Whitchurch-Stouffville Hydro in November.

Tatone, who represented Ward 3 for six years, created a stir when he resigned his council seat Oct. 12 then took over as Hydro GM three weeks later.

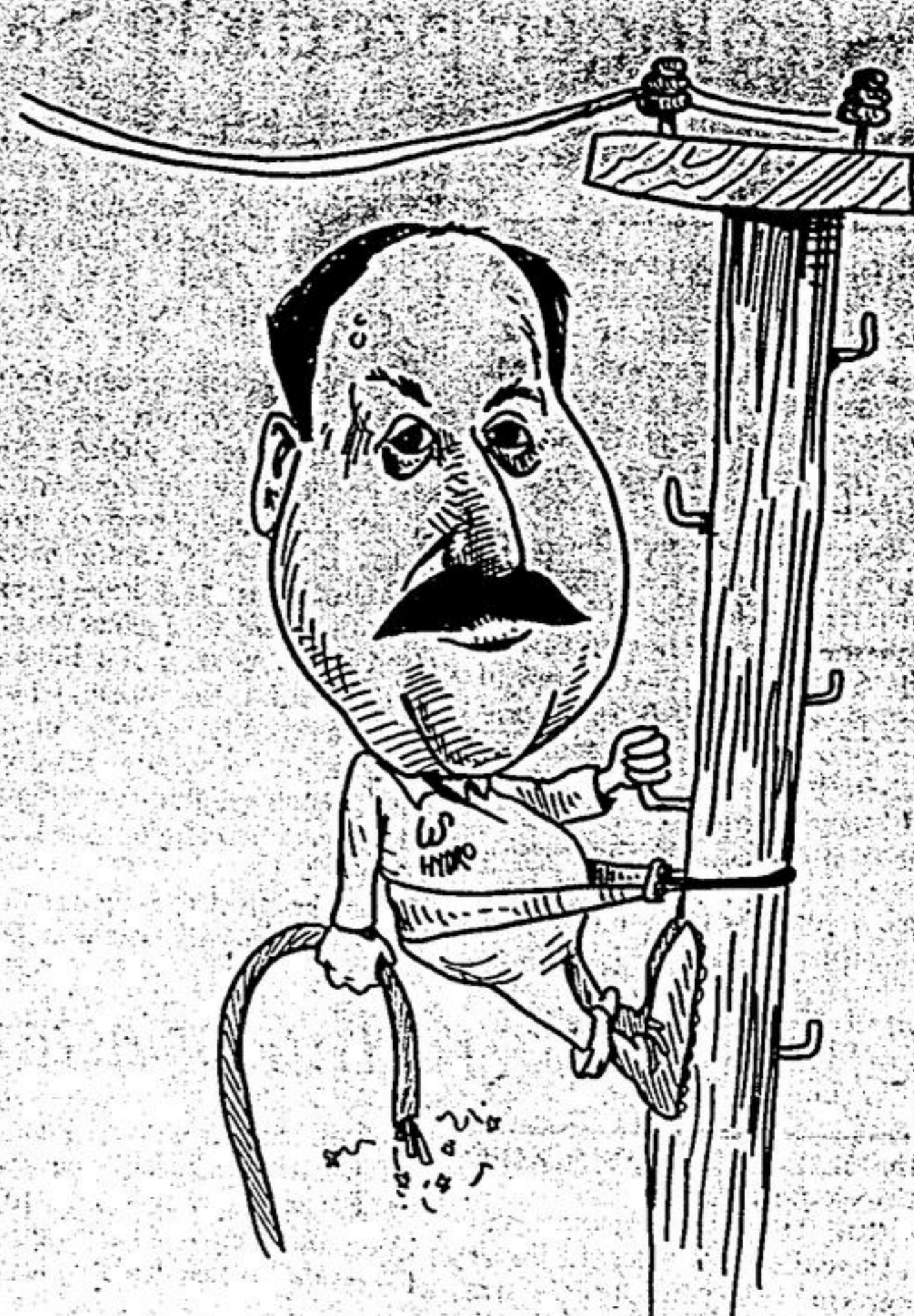
He explained he stepped down from council because he knew he was going to be away on business for the month of October and didn't feel he should be paid for that time since council's term was ending in November.

Tatone's GM position becomes a three-day-a-week job at the end of February 1995. He said he would work towards streamlining the hydro commission and making it more cost effective for the benefit of town residents.

When first voted onto council in 1988, Tatone had said he had his sights set on becoming mayor some day. But he changed his mind along the way.

"I think six years was enough," said Tatone. "I really learned a lot. It definitely broadened my perspective."

Earlier in the year, Tatone had gone on record as suggesting the town could cut administrative costs by reducing the number of wards now existing in the town from six to four.
