Al Yetman wants to help Stouffville live up to its designation of Music Town Ontario.

"I belong to quite a number of fiddle and musical groups in different communities. I've been here for about a year and a half and I'm looking for people who would like to play for the hospital and seniors homes in the general area."

Yetman has been seeking members to join the Stouffville Melody Makers through an ad on Classicomm, but of the calls he has received so far, only one has come from the immediate area. He is hoping to attract people who play by ear and can perform well-known songs on request "and if they can read music, that's even better."

Although he originally planned to hold rehearsals at his home, he anticipates he'll need a larger facility and would welcome offers of a venue in town. With many other communities, including Nobleton, Oshawa, Whitby, Port Perry and Orillia, supporting similar ventures, said Yetman, the concept seems a natural progression for Music Town. "The whole idea is that you have fun making people happy."

Congratulations to Jane Whitwell of Gormley, who received a National Volunteer Recognition Award at the 44th Annual Convention of the International Arabian Horse Association (IAHA) in Nashville Tennessee last month.

The recipient is judged on a number of criteria,
