Senior Spartans hope to spike it rich at OFSAA playdowns

It was a pair of firsts for Stouffville District Secondary School teams at the recent York Region Secondary Athletic Association girls' volleyball finals.

The Spartans senior girls' volleyball team made history by winning the YRSSAA AA crown to become the first school girls' volleyball unit to compete in the OFSAA finals.

The midget Spartans grabbed the title in their first ever YRSSAA AAA championship after moving up from AA this season.

The senior Spartans, who left at noon Tuesday for the OFSAA senior girls volleyball championship in Stratford, won all three sets played at the YRSSAA finals at Woodbridge HS Feb. 23. The Spartans swept the host squad 15-1, 15-6, the outlasted Sutton DHS 15-8, 10-15, 15-5 in a three game set in preliminary pool play.

The Stouffville squad dumped Sutton 15-9, 15-6 in the finals.

The effort was helped by Jen Cowley and Jen Pare, who divided the setting duties. Melissa Austin, Christi Henderson, Andrea Crothers, Michelle Gilroy and Leana Milos stood out defensively. Jean Turchan and Jen McLeod contributed as well.

Spartans coach Sheila Coleman said the Spartans will add junior Spartans players Nicole Bardell and Stephanie Summerill for the OFSAA competition, which runs today and Thursday. She said she has no idea of what to expect from the competition at the Stratford event.

"I really don't know how we'll do," said Coleman. "But I don't think we've got the height and overall size to win it all," added the veteran coach. "I just hope we do well."

The school's midget Spartans downed Markville SS in two straight games in the YRSSAA midget AAA showdown played Feb. 24 at Vaughan SS. The Spartans took the first game 15-10, then prevailed 16-14 in the second contest. Danielle Timms got the Spartans off on the right foot in the nerve racking final, serving up nine consecutive points to put her team ahead 9-1. But Markville came back with 13 points in a row to take a 14-9 lead.

However, Alison Crowder sealed the win by offering up seven straight successful serves.

"They've played better, but it was exciting volleyball," noted Spartans coach Sue Leroy. Leroy pointed to the efforts of Crowder, Timms, Tanis McKnight and Denise Gaeta as being key to her team's victory.

The junior girls' Spartans placed third in their YRSSAA AAA final on Feb. 24.
