

Council to debate capital projects

A total of \$1.5 million is earmarked for the library. The library has outgrown itself, the mayor said. The Main Street facility is 7,000-square feet. "They tell me they need 17,000 square feet," said Emmerson.

Water needs in Stouffville, including the Ballantrae water project is listed at \$6.6 million.

A total of \$1.5 million is targeted for a public works building. "This includes the cost of the land," said Emmerson. Municipal officials have also stated that Whitchurch-Stouffville has outgrown the old hall on Civic Avenue.

Listed in the municipality's capital project budget agenda, the plan calls for a town hall office design to be passed for '95. Meanwhile, office design-phase two is slated for '96 with construction start-up scheduled for '97.

On April 25 during a regular council meeting to begin at 7 p.m., Whitchurch-Stouffville council is expected to ratify its five-year capital forecast budget as well as its \$12.2-million operating budget.

If the budget is passed, the average taxpayer based on a \$23,000 assessment will pay \$521 for the municipal portion of the tax bill.

Emmerson stressed that this budget reflects a "zero" per cent tax increase.

Emmerson said he hopes York Region and both school boards can also hold the line when delivering their budgets. "I especially would like to see the school boards take a hard look at things," said Emmerson. On Thursday, the York Region Board of Education budget committee, approved its budget. It reflects a 2.9 per cent tax hike for the average Whitchurch-Stouffville residential taxpayer. If the committee recommendation is adopted by the public school board, the average tax payer will pay about \$50 more.

York council and the school boards will finalize budgets within the next few weeks. Meanwhile, if York region takes the freeze approach and doesn't raise taxes, the average residential property owner and public school supporter in Whitchurch-Stouffville will pay about \$3,050 in taxes this year.

before safety," said Farnan.

During the April 11 and April 12 blitz, more than 100 enforcement officers specifically targeted unsafe vehicles.

In total, 548 trucks were escorted off Highway 400 and the surrounding area.

Of the five local trucks inspected, one local truck passed with flying colors.

The most common of the 467 charges laid were for failure to maintain the vehicle, defective brakes, defective tires and insecure loads.

When police inspectors stopped a tractor-trailer on Major McKenzie Dr., the inspection showed that the vehicle, owned by Apache Freight Lines Ltd., was in sound working order, but it was missing its safety sticker.

George Hume, president of the Stouffville trucking firm, said the truck's safety sticker has fallen off. "It's been corrected now," said Hume.

Mike Goslar, manager of Impact Auto Auction, is waiting for a report telling him that he passed the test after one of his trucks was found to be defect-free.

"Some of my trucks were stopped three and four times in one day," said Goslar.

Both Hume and Goslar applaud the industry crackdown.

"Sure I support what they're doing," said Goslar.

Two recent deaths involving tires flying off trucks, triggered the government action.
