The Spartans dominated all three games played enroute to the championship at the soggy competition, which was played despite rain which fell most of the day.

The host squad started out with a mercy-shortened 10-2 victory over Father Bressani CHS.

The Spartans scored seven runs in the second inning, with Ryan Jefferson's triple the big blow. Pitchers Ryan Burkholder and Jay Nesbitt combined for the three inning game.

In game two, the SDSS unit bombed King City HS 16-0 in another three inning affair. Dan Tardella's first inning homer triggered a seven run outburst. Brad Hackert and Scott Clubine each



scored three runs. Burkholder and Nesbitt pitched the shutout.

The Spartans routed Huron Hts SS 13-2 in the title match as left hander Paul Koert struck out 12 batters in the five inning match. Ian Ellis cracked a two-run homer and a triple for the Spartans. Shawn Sargeant had a two run double and a two run single. Graham Crowder also came up with a two run single. Ellis was named tournament MVP for the Spartans.

A girls slo-pitch tournament originally scheduled for the same day was cancelled due to the rain. It will be played next Thursday.

Ellis was the hero in Tuesday's York Region Secondary School Athletic Association contest as his two run homer in extra innings gave the Spartans a 4-3 victory over Bradford in the Stouffville team's home opener.

With the score tied 2-2 after six regulation innings, Bradford took a 3-2 lead in the top of the seventh. But Ellis' timely round tripper made a winner of pitcher Koert.

The Spartans are at home to Huron Hts on Tuesday at the town park.
