Blue carpet unfurled for Tory MPP Munro

Stouffville's makers and shakers are rolling out the "blue carpet" for the newly elected Durham York MPP Julia Munro.

Munro, a 52-year-old school teacher, experienced a landslide victory after capturing the seat from New Democratic Party (NDP) member Larry O'Connor.

Ron Shannon, president of

Whitchurch-Stouffville Chamber of Commerce, told *The Tribune* that Thursday's election results will prompt a "positive mentality" in the province.

The defeat of the majority held New Democratic Party government and the Progres-



sive Conservative's victory, complete with a majority has impressed the local businessman.

"Ontario was not the place to invest under the NDP," said Shannon.

"If we were trying to sell

Ontario abroad, they made it difficult."

Whitchurch-Stouffville mayor Wayne Emmerson said local council is "looking forward to working with Julia."

Premier-elect Mike Harris made his share of commitments during the 42-day election campaign, stressed Emmerson.

"He made a lot of promises. I just hope he can keep them. I hope he can carry out his plans," the mayor said.

Many municipal officials are wondering how the new government will deal with transfer payments to the municipalities. Emmerson is no exception.

"When it comes to transfer payments, we'll have to wait and see. There's a whole restructuring going on."

Emmerson said this is no ordinary election.

"This is not just another government. This is not just another election," he said.
