Rebels suffer first loss of season but rebound with win

The Claremont Rebels suffered their first loss of the North York Fastball League season June 6, falling 7-5 to Davisville in a road contest.

The Rebels, who rebounded to hang a 10-0 shutout defeat on Bramalea the following night at home, came back from a 4-0 deficit at the end of the third inning to make it close against Davisville.

The Claremont squad scored three runs in the fourth as Brad Evans banged a double to drive in the first Rebels run, and Rob Parcells and Jim

Closs singled in runs.

The Rebels tied it at 4-4 in the top of the fifth frame on another RBI single by Brad Evans.

But Davisville put the game away with a trio of runs in the home half of the fifth.

Rebels starting pitcher Tim Evans pitched well against a powerful Davisville lineup.

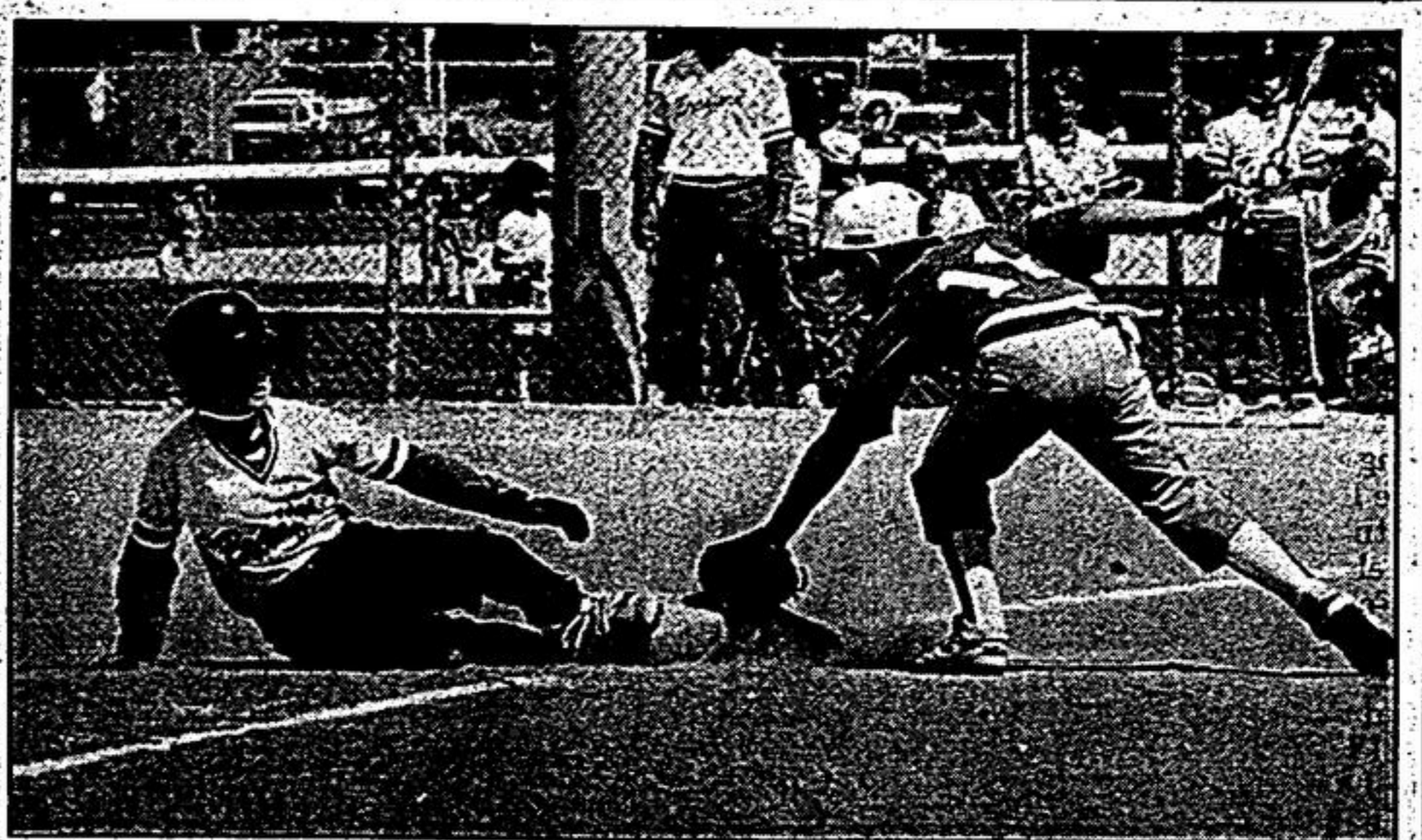
But he was forced to leave the game after taking a line drive off his knee in the fifth inning. Evans returned the following night, playing second base.

The Rebels had it all their own way in the game with Bramalea as pitcher Scott Evans gave up a lead off single in the first inning, then buckled down to retire 18 of the final 19 batters he faced.

Evans, who was playing despite a touch of the flu, struck out 11.

Jason Yoshida and Closs each had a pair of RBIs, while Tim Evans, Brad Evans, Parcells and Jamie Showers each scored a pair of runs.

Tim Evans banged three singles. Parcells and Closs had two singles apiece.

Morrison earns honors

Uxbridge Bruins' forward Brian Morrison has been nominated for the Ontario Hockey Association Player of the Year Award by the Provincial Junior A Hockey league.

Morrison, 21, led the Provincial League's East Division in scoring for the 1994-95 season with 124 points, including 53 goals in 48 games. The fourth year captain with the Newmarket 87s finished second in the overall Provincial League points chase.

For Morrison, who combined with his 18-year-old brother Aaron to give the 87s a formidable one-two punch this past season, it was the perfect conclusion to a prolific junior career. He was selected to the Provincial League all star team for the 1993-94 season and gain this past campaign.

Morrison will be among 15 OHA players from the Junior A, B and C levels who will be honored at the 106th OHA annual meeting June 17 at the Radisson Hotel in London.

He will receive a memento of the occasion, along with a scholarship in the form of a \$500

bursary to a Canadian university or college. However, Morrison may have to pass on the funding assistance as he is planning to head off to The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio this fall.

Stavro recently held a rookie tryout for the team in Toronto and anticipates being ready for the 1995-96 season.

New Bruins president Dennis Gray echoed the uncertainty shortly after his election to the top Bruins post recently.

Gray said while he considered the Stouffville franchise as a positive development, the Bruins would have to give the new operation a while to get established before considering any kind of possible affiliation arrangement.

Livingston brings home national title

Stouffville's Emilie Livingston is a national champion.

The 12 year old returned from Winnipeg this past weekend with the 1995 Canadian Rhythmic Gymnastics novice division championship.

Emilie qualified for the national event by winning the title at the East Regional Rhythmic Gymnastic Championships in New Brunswick May 19 to 21.

With the victory, Emilie now goes on to the Elite Canada championships in 1996.

Emilie, who has been involved in rhythmic gymnastics for a year and a half, previously practiced artistic gymnastics for six years. She presently trains in Toronto.

Emilie will compete in an international rhythmic gymnastics competition in Toronto on July 1.

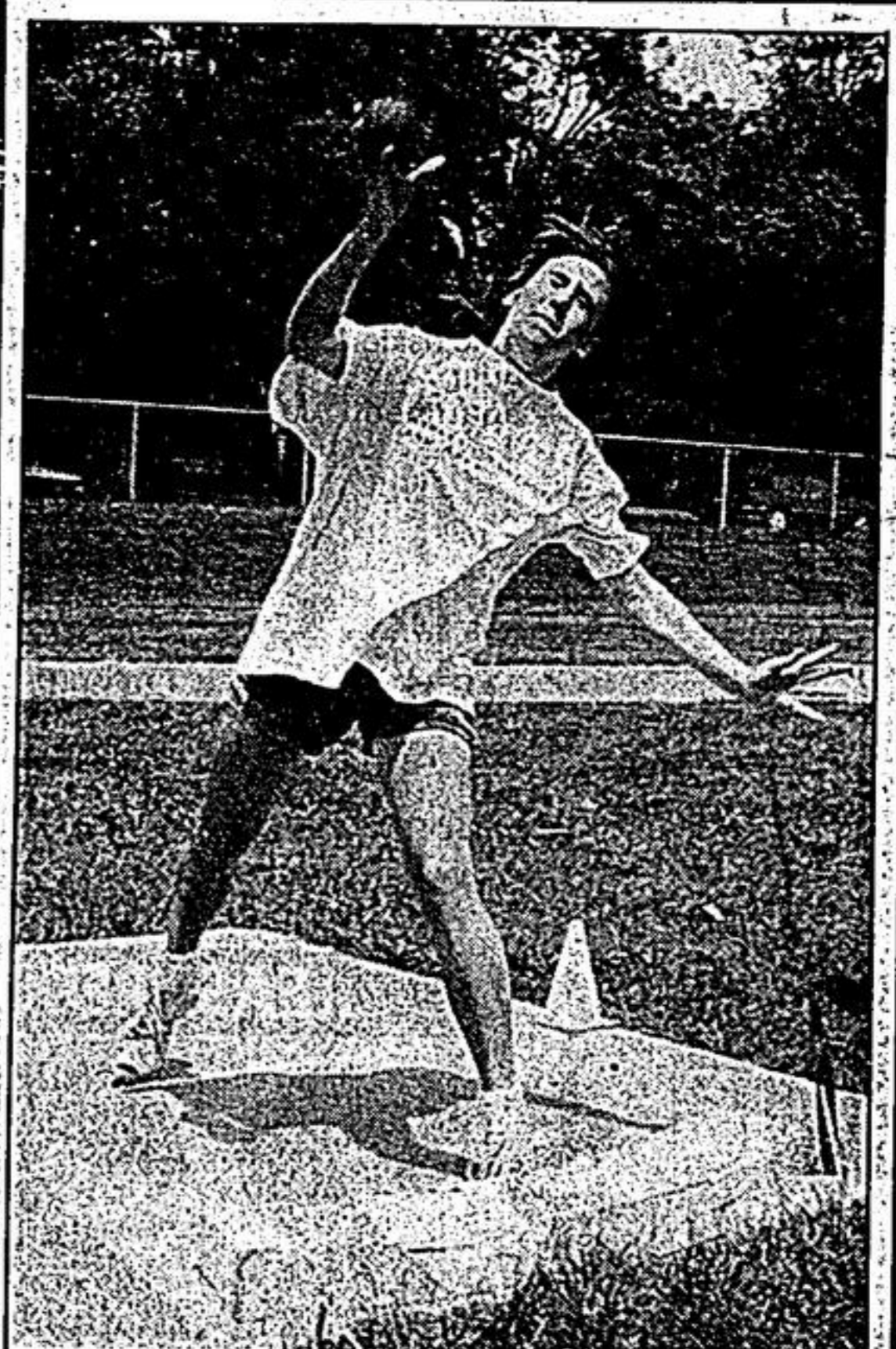
