Chatsworth featured a warm yellow and orange border next to a cool blue and white one. The horse shoe-shaped border at Hadspen House takes you

through all the colors of the spectrum. There is even a "Black Border" at Oxford Botanic Garden. The winner of the "most popular plant at this time of the year" award is Lavatera - not the annual

variety that grows 12 to 18 inches but a hardy perennial that reaches shrub-like proportions with large blooms in shades of pink. Lavatera "Barnsley", introduced by Rosemary Verey, has white flowers with a pink eye and has just recently become available here. Coming a close second is the Buddleia or Butterfly Bush, which certainly lives up to its name by attracting clouds of butterflies to its arching sprays of blooms in shades of white, pinks and mauve. On an earlier trip, I first saw a yellow flowered cultivar - this is now available here under the name "Sungold".

One of the most beautiful perennials in the gardens was the now refined roadside weed - goldenrod. We saw forms from 18 inches to six feet tall under the botanic name Solidago - all adding their glorious golden shades to the plantings. It was often used in floral arrangements in our hotels and no one suffered any allergic reactions. It is sad that many people shun this plant, having confused it with the villain ragweed. Britain is abloom with hanging baskets - especially the shops and particularly the pubs. The most often used plants were the small flowered petunias grown from cuttings, the velvety-leaved helichrysum (often called licorice plant or silver fleece vine) and bidens ferulifolia, a simple yellow flower on a plant that drapes beautifully.

Back at home, when you visit the CNE this year, you will find the garden displays and competitions not in the horticultural building but in the southeast corner of the Better Living Centre. Special congratulations to the horticultural societies whose theme gardens are well worth a visit.

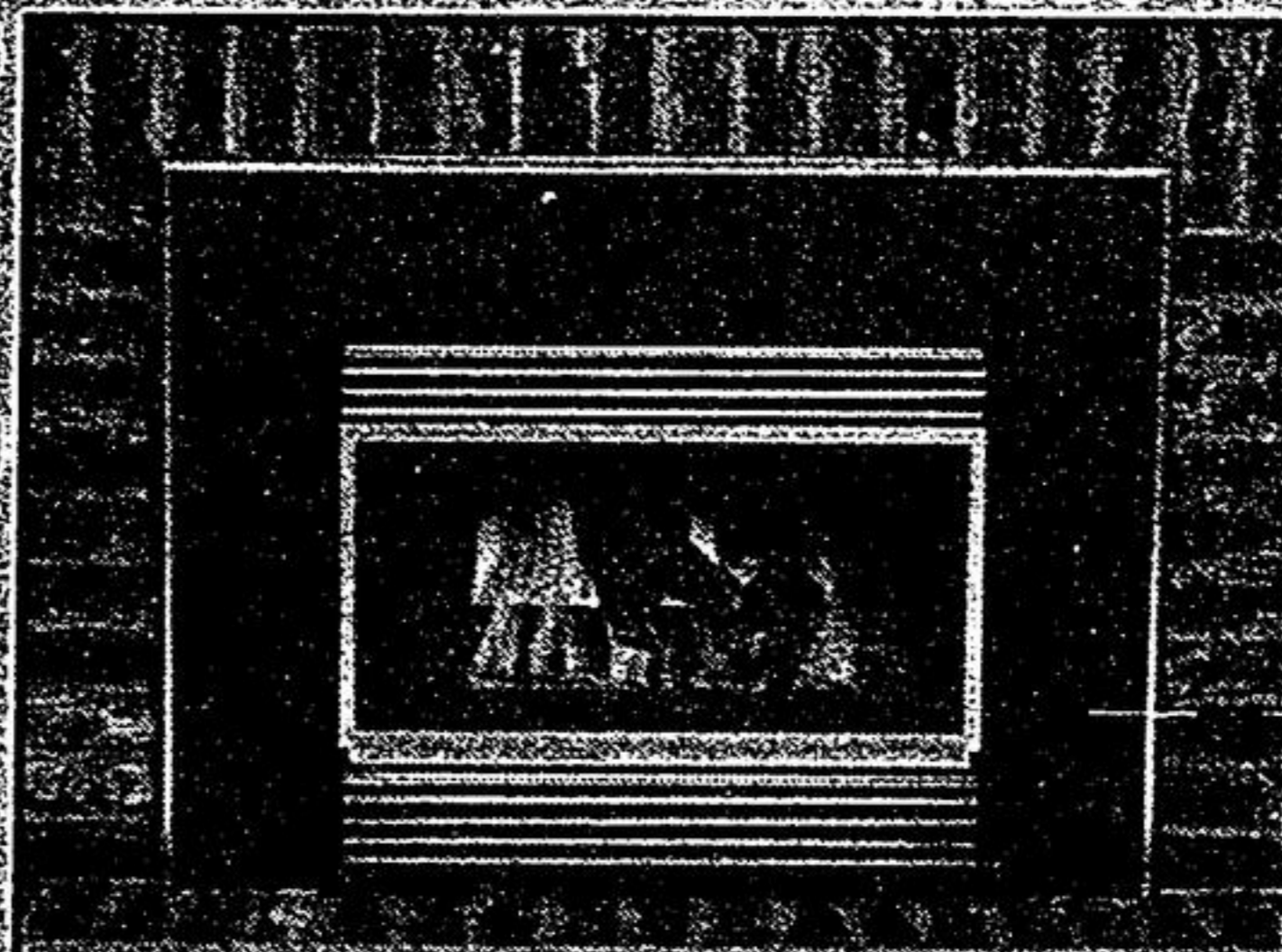

**Self esteem created with love**

Question: What are some of the factors that hinder parents from building their child's self-esteem?

Dr. Dobson: We all want super children who will amaze the world. Let's face it, folks, we have met the enemy and it is us.

Often the greatest damage is unintentionally inflicted right in the home, which should be the child's sanctuary and fortress. Furthermore, I have observed in working with parents that their own feelings of inferiority make it difficult for them to accept imperfections in their children.
