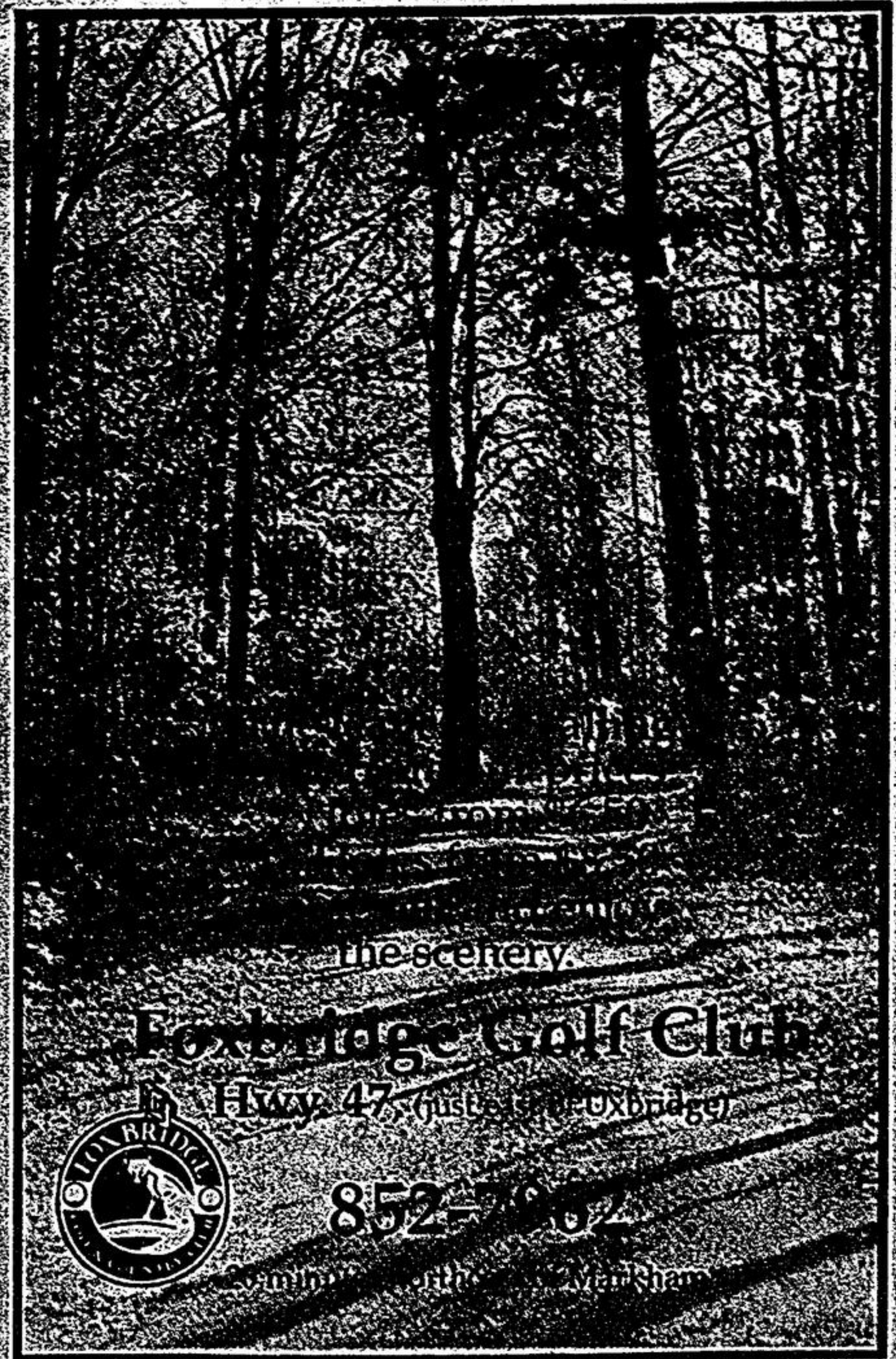
TAMMY SUTTON-BROWN

Low intellect may result from lack of early teaching

Question: What causes a child to be a "slow-learner"?
Dr. Dobson: There are many hereditary, environmental and physical factors that contribute to one's intellect, and it is difficult to isolate the particular influences. In some cases, however, accumulating evidence seems to indi-

cate that dull normal intelligence and even borderline retardation can be caused by a lack of intellectual stimulation in the child's very early years. There appears to be a critical period during the first three to four years when the potential for intellectual growth must be seized. If the opportunity is

missed, the child may never reach the capacity that had originally been available to him. The slow-learning child can be one who has not heard adult language clearly. He has not been provided with interesting books and puzzles to occupy his sensory apparatus. He has not been taken to the zoo, airport or other exciting places. He has grown up with a minimum of daily training and guidance from adults. The lack of stimulation available to such a child may result in the failure of enzyme systems to develop properly in the brain.

that to be true, what are the collective implications of that poor self-concept?
Dr. Dobson: It has serious implications for the stability of the North American culture, because the health of an entire society depends on the ease with which its individual members can gain personal acceptance. Thus, whenever the keys to self-esteem are seemingly out of reach for a large percentage of people, as in 20th century America today, then widespread mental illness, neuroticism, hatred, alcoholism, drug abuse, violence and social disorder will certainly occur. Personal worth is not something human beings are free to take or leave. We must have it, and when it is unattainable, everybody suffers.
