Town staff launches service improvement program

What do you think of Whitchurch-Stouffville? Town officials want to know.

A "How Are We Doing?" program has been launched by Merlin

Dewing, the town's chief administrative officer.

Postage paid, pre-addressed reply cards are now available at most municipal office counters.

They're to be filled out and put into the mail.

The cards will be used to

improve the town's delivery of services," stressed Dewing.

"I consider this program a big step towards service excellence and encourage the public and business people to help us serve better," said Dewing.

Opening the lines of communi-

cation is an "essential ingredient" in making the town appear more user-friendly, a message that was heard when the chamber of commerce met with council and senior staff earlier this year, said Dewing.

Blue Box additions now accepted

Beginning this week, Blue Boxes in Stouffville can include junk mail, clean cardboard, egg cartons and boxboard such as juice cartons and cereal boxes

Last week, Whitchurch-Stouffville council agreed to expand the Blue Box program in town as a way to reduce the amount of waste finding its way to landfill

sites. At the present time, cardboard is not collected at curbsides in Stouffville.

However, contaminated cardboard is collected and sent to landfill sites.

Residents are asked to fold, flatten and tie it into small bundles.

Expanding the program means more blue boxes are available through the town at a cost of \$6.50 each.
