Treatment options now available for benign prostatic enlargement

Benign prostatic enlargement (BPH) is one of the most common diseases of older men. Clinically, it produces symptoms such as frequent urination, incomplete emptying of the bladder, night time urination, bladder infection and a slow urinary flow.

For over a century, the mainstay of treatment for BPH has been surgery (either TURP or open prostatectomy). Although surgical techniques have improved, making them safer and more effective, there are now many other options available.

In some instances, BPH progresses very slowly and immediate treatment may not even be necessary. This is called watchful waiting.

Plant extracts are also touted to shrink the prostate although none have ever been proven to be effective.

There are several new drugs available which are effective in some individuals. They either shrink the size of the prostate (Proscar) or relax the muscle around the prostate and decrease the pressure within it to allow for easier urination (Hytrin).

Newer, non-surgical treatments have recently been developed which, although not as effective as surgery, may give excellent relief of symptoms in some individuals. These include microwave thermotherapy (not covered by OHIP \$3,500 - \$5,000), laser prostatectomy (experimental) and vaporization of the prostate. All of these can potentially be performed as same day procedures and involve almost no bleeding.

It is important to remember that individual cases may vary. Always demand as much information as possible about alternative treatments (and even try one) before finally going ahead with prostate surgery.
