tain H.T.W. Grant, D.S.O., R.C.N., boasted a crew of 900, 37 per cent of whom were from this province. 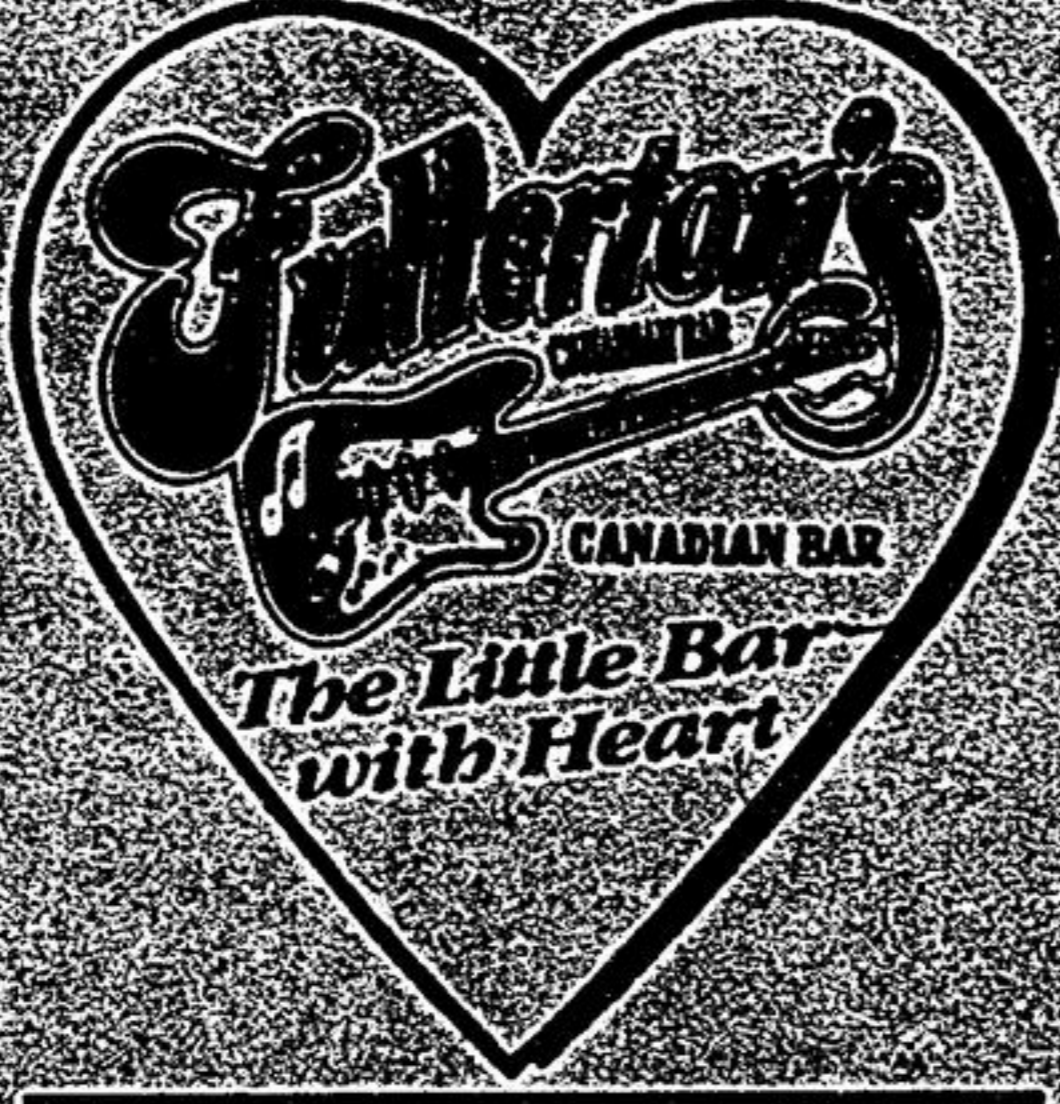
WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

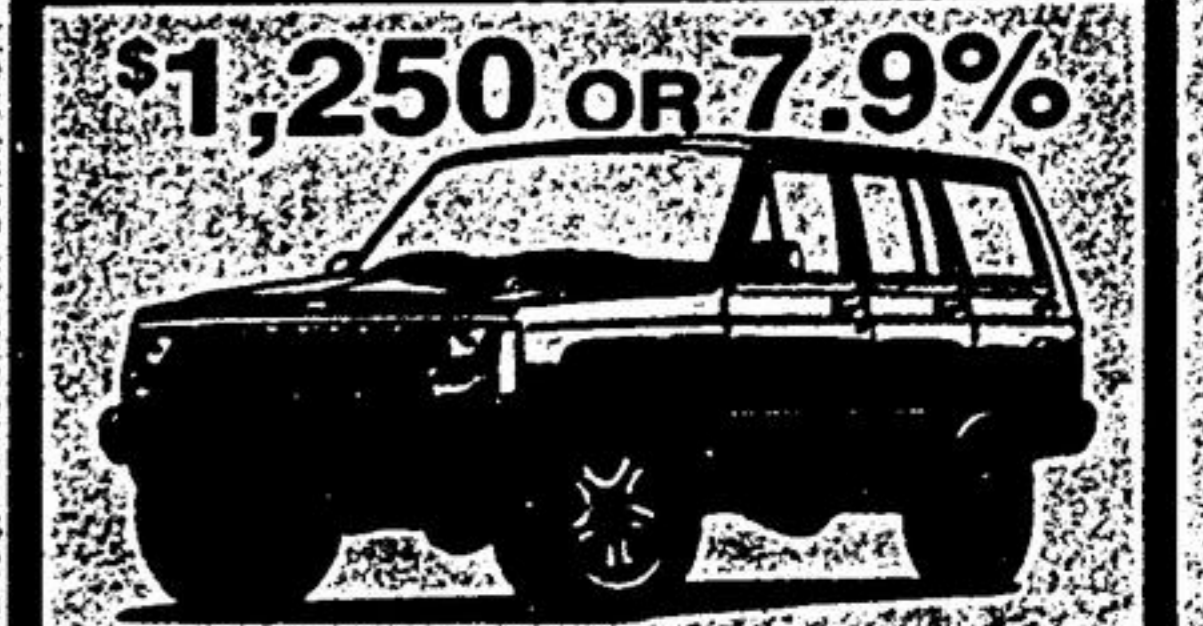
