

Bantam Stingrays spike gold

The Stouffville Stingrays came home champions from the recent Ontario Volleyball Association Tier II bantam girls tournament held at Unionville High School.

Playing in only their third tournament since the team was formed last fall, the Stouffville squad won 10 of their 12 games played to collect the gold medal. After dropping both games by narrow margins to the Etobicoke Falcons I squad in their first preliminary round match, the Stingrays bounced back to defeat the Scarborough Astros, the Etobicoke Falcons II team, and the Belleville Cougars to place second in their pool.

The Stingrays defeated the Cougars 15-12, 15-4 in the semi-

finals then prevailed over the Falcons I squad by scores of 15-8, 15-12 in the championship round.

Angie Scott earned the nod as most outstanding Stouffville player. Abigail Barnett, Marlee Johnson and Tori Woods also shone. Michele Zaphropoulos and Jennifer Coysh made a strong contribution as well.

"The girls really played together at this tournament and their skills and knowledge of the game have greatly improved since their first tournament in November," said Stingrays coach Don Forbes.

The Stingrays will take part in the Tier II Bantam Challenge Cup in Etobicoke Feb. 10.

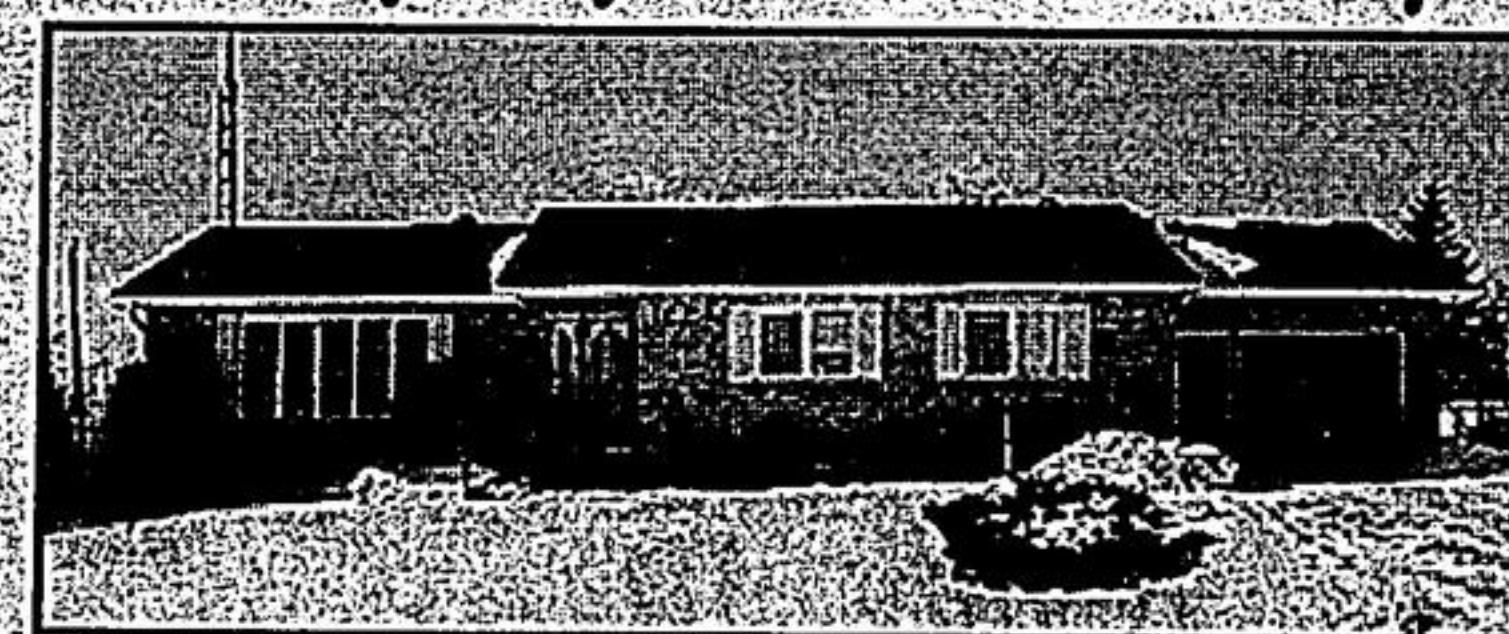
