

Veteran's Week Nov. 3-11

The seven-day period leading up to Remembrance Day has been declared Veteran's Week by Prime Minister Jean Chretien, a Stouffville man is reminding everyone.

George Lovett, a member of the local Royal Canadian Legion - Branch 459, has stressed that in recognition of the achievements and sacrifices of Canadians at home and overseas during wartime and in peacekeeping operations around the world, and in the recommendation of the minister of veterans affairs and secretary of state, the government of Canada declares that the period beginning Nov. 3 and ending Nov. 11 shall be known as Veteran's Week.

Dave McQuacker, president of the local legion is also pointing out that the Remembrance-Poppy campaign will begin at the end of October.

"This annual campaign is the legion's highest profile public activity," said McQuacker. "It is the only event which ultimately involves all legion members."

Meanwhile, McQuacker emphasized that Nov. 11 is a time to think of our heritage -- "a heritage based on freedom."

He added, "It is a time to remember that freedom is always earned and that sometimes it must be defended."

Attempted murder trial date to be set

John Murray Bolender, 41, who's been held in custody since his Aug. 21 arrest at his business place on Hwy 48, will appear in a Newmarket court on Oct. 16 to have a judge set the trial date.

Bolender, formerly of Goodwood, was charged after two men visited Markham Stouffville Hospital suffering minor gunshot wounds.

The men, both in their late 20's, told police they were shot after being discovered on the 90-acre property at 1 a.m.

In a search, police uncovered a crop of marijuana growing on a hill.
