

Prize-winning Parkview residents were talk of fair

A WINNING COMBINATION

Congratulations to Isobel Coleman and Mildred Gomoll, both of whom reside at Parkview Home. The 83-year-old Coleman captured first place honors at this year's Markham Fair for her beautiful hand-knitted baby's christening dress. Two years ago, this talented knitter won both first prize and Grand Champion for another baby's dress, which her family had framed and which now takes pride of place on her wall at Parkview. Gomoll, 91, is an accomplished poet whose work has been published on a number of occasions. One of her recent poems, entitled "My Daily Task - by Herc' Part I," was featured in the September issue of *Mature Lifestyles* and another work, "In The South - by Herc' Part II," was selected as a semi-finalist in a contest sponsored by the Poetry Club of America, which receives submissions from across North America.

WHITE CANE DAY

International White Cane Day on Oct. 15 is a time to reflect on the dire situation faced by many blind people in Third World countries, noted Art Brooker, national director of Christian Blind Mission International (CBMI), on Stouffville Rd. "A social safety net like we have here in Canada doesn't exist in these poorer countries," he said. "Often people who are blind lack even the most simple aids, such as white canes or schooling, which would give them a degree of mobility and autonomy. The fact that all too often blind individuals are shut out from mainstream society adds to their helplessness." Blind children are particularly vulnerable, said Brooker. "An estimated 90 per cent of these children never get the chance to go to school." Statistics show that there are 40 million blind people in the world and that the most common cause of blindness is cataracts. Approximately half of those affected could be cured through surgical intervention. CBMI specializes in the treatment and prevention of blindness through cataract surgery in Asia, Africa and Latin America, at an average cost of \$27 per operation. More than 50,000 blind and visually impaired individuals are currently receiving an education through projects supported by CBMI, which is recognized by the World Health Organization. 
