"While it's a critical issue and involved a lot of money, I doubt that my colleagues will agree to invited public input, still I will try," she said.

The complex is slated for the Main Street and Duffin's Creek area.

This was the second robbery at the store in three weeks. On October 15, thieves made off with \$5,000 worth of clothing.

"They were more selective in that one. They picked through. But, this time, they just took it all," said Kubica. Money was also taken from a cash register

and cash from a filing cabinet. "They cleaned me out of cash too. It's all gone," said Kubica.

Entry to the Main Street store was made through an upstairs window. The robbery was discovered Thursday morning. The most difficult part is having thieves take control of your business decisions, stressed Kubica.

# Councillors to fight LCBO openings

Booze will be on the table at the Whitchurch-Stouffville council chamber tonight.

Local council is being asked to comment on the move to have the town's liquor store and beer store open three Sundays in December.

In a letter, the Liquor Control Board of Ontario asked council to give direction regarding the provincial government's plan to keep local alcohol outlets open Dec. 8, Dec. 15 and Dec. 22.

If council has no objections, the letter from the board is formal notice that Stouffville's liquor and beer stores will be open on the Sundays. The move will be the beginning of seven-days-a-week alcohol sales. Ward 1 councillor Ivanka Bradley is suggesting

"Years ago, income tax was introduced as a temporary measure," said Bradley. "This is no different. If we just go along with it, we'll have

liquor and beer sales seven days a week. This is the beginning. I'm speaking out against."

Also voicing strong opposition will be Ward 3 councillor Margot Marshall. "There's only so much money to go around," said Marshall. "There doesn't seem to be any time for family. Let's not have this, especially at Christmas. Let's make Christmas is for the family. It's not for this."

Although not thrilled with the idea, councillor Cliff Dunkeld said he'll go along with the proposed Sunday alcohol sales. "I don't like it, but it's part of people's lives," said Dunkeld. "They'll buy it on Saturdays anyway."

Mayor Wayne Emmerson is not impressed that the province would ask municipalities for input. "If the managers want it, it's entirely up to them," he said of the managers of the Stouffville beer store and liquor store.
